SC Court of Appeals

- 1. Should the Court of Appeals Hold that this action is barred by res judicata?
- 2. Did the Court of Appeals Receive This Appeal In A Timely Manner?

STATEMENT OF THE CASE

The Petitioner, Petitioner hired a lawyer, a legal representation based on dismissal hearing with statements that the Petitioner does not have to follow only S.C. 

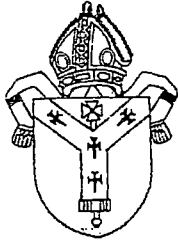

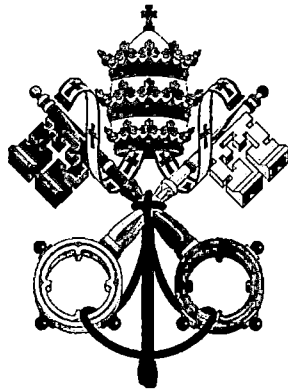

EXPRESSING THE CONGRATULATIONS OF THE MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO THE SANTEE INDIAN ORGANIZATION ON RECEIVING THE HIGHEST HONOR OF BEING GRANTED RECOGNITION AS A "TRIBE" BY THE BOARD OF THE SOUTH CAROLINA COMMISSION ON MINORITY AFFAIRS.

Whereas, the ancestors of today's Native American Indians inhabited the land of the present day South Carolina; and

Whereas, Native American Indians have traditionally exhibited respect for our finite natural resources through a deep reverence for the Earth; and

Whereas, many ancestors suffered and perished in the lands to which their descendents now maintain a powerful spiritual connection, as is evidenced by their customs and legends; and

Whereas, Indian people are resilient and determined to preserve, develop, and transmit to future generations their unique cultural identities; and

Whereas, Native American Indians have served with valor in all of the Nation's wars from the Revolutionary War through Operation Iraqi Freedom; and

Whereas, Native American Indians have made distinct and important contributions to the United States, South Carolina, and the rest of the world in many fields, including agriculture, medicine, music, language, and art, and they have distinguished themselves as inventors, entrepreneurs, spiritual leaders, and scholars; and

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

TO MEMORIALIZE THE PRESIDENT AND THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO TAKE NECESSARY STEPS TO EFFECT FORMAL RECOGNITION OF THE FOUR HOLES INDIAN ORGANIZATION EDISTO TRIBAL COUNCIL AND THE EASTERN CHEROKEE, SOUTHERN IROQUOIS, AND UNITED TRIBES OF SOUTH CAROLINA.

Whereas, the area comprising the territory of the State of South Carolina has been the home of Indian tribes and peoples prior to colonial times; and

Whereas, the first settlers in the land that later became the State of South Carolina found it inhabited by people the settlers called Indians and throughout history, many of the descendants of these Indian tribes first encountered by the Spanish and the English settlers have continuously maintained their homes in the State of South Carolina; and

Whereas, such Indian tribes and their descendants did contribute and have continued to contribute to the settlement and growth of the State of South Carolina; and

Whereas, such Indian tribes have maintained their ethnic background; and

Whereas, recognition of such American Indian tribes by the federal government would correct a historical oversight and be of assistance to these Indian peoples in obtaining federal funds set aside for Native Americans. Now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring:

That the President and Congress of the United States are hereby memorialized, requested, and urged to take the steps as are necessary to effect the formal recognition of the following Indian tribes and organizations whose members reside within the borders of the State of South Carolina:

(1) the Four Holes Indian Organization Edisto Tribal Council of South Carolina whose members now reside in Dorchester, Colleton, and Charleston counties; and

(2) the Eastern Cherokee, Southern Iroquois, and United Tribes of S.C. also known as the Cherokee Indian Tribe of South Carolina whose members now reside in Richland, Newberry, Anderson, Oconee, Pickens, Greenville, Laurens, and Spartanburg counties.

Be it further resolved that the provisions of this resolution are effective only for the purposes of eligibility of any programs for Native Americans after this resolution has been adopted.

Be it further resolved that copies of this resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States, the presiding officers of the Senate and House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States, and each member of the South Carolina congressional delegation.

A BILL

TO RECOGNIZE THE CHICORA-WACCAMAW INDIAN TRIBE AND THE PEE DEE INDIAN TRIBE AS INDIAN TRIBES OF SOUTH CAROLINA REPRESENTING THE CHICORA-WACCAMAW INDIAN PEOPLE AND THE PEE DEE INDIAN PEOPLE, RESPECTIVELY, AND TO CONFER UPON THEM SUCH RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES AS ARE PROVIDED BY LAW TO INDIAN TRIBES OF THIS STATE.

Amend Title To Conform

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina:

"SECTION 1. The State of South Carolina by this act recognizes the Catawba Indian Nation, the Chicora-Waccamaw Indian People, the Pee Dee Indian Tribe, the Piedmont American Indian Association Lower Eastern Cherokee Nation, the Santee Indian Organization of Holly Hill, the Beaver Creek Tribe of Pee Dee Indians, the Edisto Indian Tribe, and Chalokowas Indian People of the Chickasaw Nation as tribes of the State of South Carolina representing the Catawba Indian People, the Chicora-Waccamaw Indian People, the Pee Dee Indian People, the Piedmont Lower Cherokee Indian People, the Santee Indian People, the Beaver Creek Pee Dee Indian People, and the Chalokowas Chickasaw Indian People, respectively. Except as provided in this act, the organization and governing of these Indian tribes shall be as provided by tribal law or agreement.

The Indian tribes recognized by this act, their members, lands, natural resources, or other property owned by the tribes or their members, are subject to the civil, criminal, and regulatory jurisdiction and laws of the State, its agencies, and political subdivisions and the civil and criminal jurisdiction of the courts of the State to the same extent as any other person, citizen, or land in the State.

Notwithstanding their recognition as Indian tribes of South Carolina or any other provision of law, the Catawba Indian Nation, the Chicora-Waccamaw Indian People, the Pee Dee Indian Tribe, the Piedmont American Indian Association Lower Eastern Cherokee Nation, the Santee Indian Organization of Holly Hill, the Beaver Creek Tribe of Pee Dee Indians, the Edisto Indian Tribe, and

Chalokowas Indian People of the Chickasaw Nation do not have the power or authority to take any action which would establish, advance, or promote any form of gambling in this State.

Nothing in this act recognizes, creates, extends, or forms the basis of any right or claim to any interest in land or real estate in this State for the Catawba Indian Nation, the Chicora-Waccamaw Indian People, the Pee Dee Indian Tribe, the Piedmont American Indian Association Lower Eastern Cherokee Nation, the Santee Indian Organization of Holly Hill, the Beaver Creek Tribe of Pee Dee Indians, the Edisto Indian Tribe, and Chalokowas Indian People of the Chickasaw Nation or for any other native American Indian tribe or nation in South Carolina."

SECTION 2. This act takes effect upon approval by the Governor.
