## ORDER

In the explanation required by Rule 243(c) of South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR), petitioner has failed to show that there is an arguable basis for asserting that the determination by the lower court was improper. Accordingly, this matter is dismissed. The remittitur will be sent as provided by Rule 221(b), SCACR.

Moreover, because petitioner has filed four applications for post-conviction relief, all of which have been without merit, petitioner shall, within twenty days of the date of this order, provide this Court with any reason(s) he may have why we should not issue an order prohibiting petitioner from filing any further collateral actions in the circuit court, including post-conviction relief actions and habeas corpus actions, as well as any motions relating to the previously filed collateral actions, challenging his convictions for murder, armed robbery, and criminal conspiracy without first obtaining permission to do so from this Court.
