## ORDER

---

The petitioner filed a document entitled "Writ of De Novo" with this court in reference to an action filed in the magistrate's court<sup>1</sup> along with other requests for action by this Court. In response to the Court's inquiry dated April 21, 2017, the petitioner confirmed that he was not attempting to file an appeal.

The petitioner's filings are dismissed for lack of appellate jurisdiction. *See* S.C. Const. art V, §9 (conferring upon the Court of Appeals "such jurisdiction as the General Assembly shall prescribe by general law"); S.C. Code § 14-8-200(a) (2017) ("Except as limited by subsection (b) and Section 14-8-260, the [Court of Appeals] has jurisdiction over any case in which an appeal is taken from an order, judgment, or decree of the circuit court, family court, a final decision of an agency, a final decision of an administrative law judge, or the final decision of the Workers' Compensation Commission."); S.C. Code § 14-8-200(b) (2017) (enumerating the types of appeals which are appealable directly to the Supreme Court); S.C. Code Ann. § 14-8-260 (2017) ("In all cases within the jurisdiction of the court as provided in this chapter, the notice of appeal must be filed with the court of appeals in the manner provided by the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules.").

<sup>1</sup> We note that a decision of a magistrate is reviewable by appeal to the circuit court of the county where the judgment was rendered. *See* Rule 18(a), South Carolina Rules of Magistrates Court.
