This responds your letter dated June 8, 2017.

In South Carolina appellate practice, the remittitur is simply a document that signals the end of appellate jurisdiction over the case. *See* Rule 221 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules; *Wise v. S.C. Dept. of Corr.*, 372 S.C. 173, 642 S.E.2d 551 (2007). The issuance of the remittitur in this case did not award you a new trial or any other relief. Instead, the judgment of this Court is that the petition for a writ of certiorari is denied which has the effect of leaving in full force and effect the order of circuit court in this case.
