ORDER

Appellant filed a Motion to Confirm Automatic Stay or Alternatively Petition for Writ of Supersedeas. Respondent filed a return, arguing the motion was procedurally premature because the order resulting from the remand was not presented to the Administrative Law Court. Appellant replied, asking for a ruling on her motion from this court because there was nothing further for the Administrative Law Court to reconsider.

Final actions of the Board of Social Work Examiners are appealable to the Administrative Law Court. S.C. Code Ann. § 40-1-160 (2011). Accordingly, we decline to act on Appellant's motion and transfer this appeal to the Administrative Law Court. *See* Rule 204(a), SCACR ("In the event the notice of appeal is filed in the wrong appellate court, the appellate court in which the matter is filed shall issue an order transferring the case to the appropriate appellate court.").
