

At a Hearing before The Honorable L. Casey Manning on April 12, 2012, the Court heard Defendant Pope's Motion to Disqualify Sweeny Wingate and Barrow, PA from representing the Office of the Attorney General of South Carolina, enjoining Russell Bauknight from purporting to speak on behalf of the Office of the Attorney General of South Carolina, and for other miscellaneous relief.
