ORDER

By order dated May 25, 2017, this Court dismissed petitioner's Notice of Appeal for failing to show there was an arguable basis for asserting the denial of his application for post-conviction relief (PCR) was improper. In addition, petitioner, who has filed four PCR applications, all of which have been denied, was given twenty days to provide this Court with any reason(s) he may have why the Court should not issue an order prohibiting him from filing any further collateral actions in the circuit court, including PCR actions and habeas corpus actions, as well as any motions relating to the previously filed collateral actions, challenging his convictions for murder, armed robbery, and criminal conspiracy without first obtaining permission to do so from this Court. Petitioner did not respond to the order. Accordingly, we hereby impose the restrictions previously stated.
