Dear Mr. Shearhouse,

I beg of you to please, please look into what is holding up my case and bond petition; and give me more information than your stock replies that "the matter is still under consideration," and that "due to the number of pending cases it is not possible to give a time frame." My case is the SECOND oldest outstanding case at the SC Supreme Court. My case was heard over 14 months ago, an inordinate amount of time, and more than enough time for an opinion to be published! It's very upsetting and distressing, and it seems the court does not care how an innocent person and her family is impacted by being falsely convicted, and an appeal that is needlessly being dragged out. If they are unwilling or unable to make a decision, then why in the world will they not please grant me a bond while they hash out details. Why is the court issuing so few opinions week after week. I have written the SC Bar, Henry McMaster, and the SC ACLU about these problems. Is there nothing at all you can do to help me, or let me know what's going on? My husband is dying of Stage IV metastatic throat cancer, and I am being kept by my family by the state for something I did NOT do, and is NOT even physically possible. This is

inexcusable, I fear it will be too late for my husband if I do not get home soon. Why will the Court not rule on the bond petition, if they are unwilling or unable to reach an opinion at this time. This nightmare has gone on long enough, and there is no sense in the Supreme Court needlessly dragging out my suffering. I need to be back home with my husband and children as soon as possible. I've been away from them and missed out on too many family moments already. Time I can never get back. Please have a heart and help me. I am in desperate need of some hope. I'm at my wit's end and can't take much more. Please, please understand the importance of this matter.
