MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Robert Bernard Campbell respectfully requests a fourth extension of thirty (30) days, **until September 22, 2017**, in which to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter are due to be filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel for Robert Bernard Campbell respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the

number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage his caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.



Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari in the case of Raphael Wooden v. The State with the Supreme Court on August 18, 2017. Counsel filed the initial reply brief of appellant in the case of The State v. John M. Ghent, Jr. with this Court on August 10, 2017. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Kevin Lee Boyter with this Court on July 26, 2017. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Crystal Garner with this Court on July 26, 2017. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Wallace Eugene Evatt, Jr. v. The State with the Supreme Court on July 24, 2017. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Kasey Marie Gilbert with this Court on July 18, 2017. Counsel filed the brief of appellant pursuant to White v. State and the petition for writ of certiorari in the case of Shonta Helton v. The State with the Supreme Court on July 14, 2017. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of The State v. Joshua Griffith with the Supreme Court on July 5, 2017. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Tekysha Cohen with this Court on June 30, 2017. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Jayquan Wilmore with this Court on June 29, 2017. Counsel filed the return to motion to stay the scheduling of a petition and return until consideration and ruling on petitioner's Rule 243(C), SCACR explanation in the death penalty case of Brad Keith Sigmon v. The State with the Supreme Court on June 23, 2017. **Counsel also has extensive administrative duties as the Chief Appellate Defender.**

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request shown by signature below.


