I need some assistance from someone in your office after receiving the letter dated 08/25/2017 stating that I had 10 days to file the plaintiff's initial brief or my case will be dismissed. The issue I have with that is I thought after you requested the court transcript which you had to do within 10 days of filing the appeal you had 60 days for them to respond and if they did not then you had to send in another request and once you did have the transcript that you had 30 days to file the initial brief. This was by the chart that your office sent me when I started the appeal. So if that is the case maybe I forgot to file something I needed to with your office because I had to send another request on the 24th to the clerk of court at Greenville County because they still have not sent the court transcript as per the request for the transcript. So is there some paperwork that I need to file again with your office stating that the court did not send the transcript and I had to re-request it on the 24<sup>th</sup> because the original paperwork for the request was sent in on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of June and 60 days would have been August 23, 2017 which just passed two days before the letter was sent from your office. And again as stated I had to send another request in on the 24<sup>th</sup> and have yet to receive the transcript as of today's date 08/29/2017 so could someone please advise me if there is a form or something that needs to be sent in to your office to let you know this fact. Because, I cannot go to the next step of the appeal until the transcript is sent from the court reporter and do not feel as though I should be penalized or my case thrown out or me to have ten days to file my initial brief when the court reporter has not to this date provided the court transcript which is key to the initial brief being submitted and pertaining to said brief being in the legal guidelines of the appeal process.
