MOTION TO EXTEND TIME TO FILE INITIAL
BRIEF OF RESPONDENT AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

The Respondent, above-named, hereby makes a second motion to the Court to extend the time of filing the Initial Brief of Respondent and Designation of Matter until October 6, 2017.

The Initial Brief of Respondent in the above action is due to be filed September 6, 2017.

Respondent is actively working on the brief and *has completed a majority of the brief*. However,

Respondent has not been able to complete the brief because of the following reasons:

Respondent's counsel has been involved in intervening cases in both state and federal court that have precluded timely completion of the Brief. Below-signed counsel has prepared and filed Return and Memorandum in U.S. District Court in Joseph Paugh v. Reynolds on July 20, 2017 and prepared and filed PCR Return on Miguel Ramirez v. State, 2017-CP-41-160 in the Court of Common Pleas on August 21, 2017. During the last weeks of July and first weeks of

August, Counsel was preparing for the PCR matters (hearings) of Tyrone Morris v. State (2013-CP-19-358), Ronnie Rouse v. State (2013-CP-19-284), and Margaret Driggers v. State (2015-CP-32-00881). At the request of Judge Lee, Counsel was also requested to draft an extensive Order of Dismissal in the PCR case of Margaret Driggers v. State, 2015-CP-32-00881, which was completed August 31st. Counsel is also preparing for the September 8, 2017, reconstruction hearing in the PCR case of Randall Sightler v. State, 2014-CP-32-3766. Due to Counsel's involvement in these and other matters pending in state and federal court, counsel is unable to timely complete and file the Initial Brief of Respondent. Thus, counsel is requesting an extension of time in which to file the Initial Brief of Respondent in this matter. This request is made in good faith, and not for the purposes of delay.

WHEREFORE, premises considered, for good cause shown, counsel hereby respectfully requests a thirty (30) day extension of time to serve and file the Initial Brief of Respondent and Designation of Matter.




