


the additional facts given to the Magistrate to supplement the affidavit, the Court finds the issuing magistrate did not have a substantial basis upon which to conclude that probable cause existed.

4. The Court finds that the supplementing testimony and the affidavit further failed to identify what if any crime was committed by this defendant.
5. The Court finds the defendant had a reasonable expectation of privacy regarding his cell phone records and that a good faith exception does not apply.
6. The Court finds that the search warrant was defective and any evidence gathered from the search warrant should be excluded.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, for the reasons stated above, Defendant's Motion to Suppress is granted.
