
Dear Counsel:

Upon reviewing your appellant's initial brief and designation of matter, the following deficiencies have been noted under the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR), and any deficiency must be corrected within ten (10) days of the date of this letter or your appeal will be dismissed:

- The accompanying proof of service is not in compliance with the SCACR. Your proof of service should be substantially in the format shown by Form 7 in Appendix C to part II of the SCACR. It is to be provided as a separate document - not as a part of the caption page of the appellant's initial brief.
- The proof of service of the appellant's initial brief and designation of matter continue to state that the "Notice of Appeal" was served, instead of stating that the appellant's initial brief and designation of matter were served.
- The caption/title does not comply with Rule 267(a), SCACR. Specifically, it contains the name of Latonya Meredith. The notice of appeal included only Quintin Marcel Meredith as an appellant.
- The caption must include the name of the document, in this case the Appellant's Initial Brief, and not the proof of service.

- The document contains the signature of, and a statement of, Latonya F. Meredith, as well as having her name included as a part of the caption. You must provide a motion to amend the notice of appeal if you wish to add Ms. Meredith as an appellant in this case.
- The document has not been signed as required by Rule 267(b), SCACR.
- There is no proof of service of the designation of matter.
