Based on a review of transcript from March 12, 2014 hearing p. six (6) lines 23-25 and p. seven (7) line 1 presided by Andrea C. Roche, former commissioner of South

Carolina Worker's Compensation Commission (Herein after SCWCC) which was inadvertently not provided to S.C. Court of Appeals states:

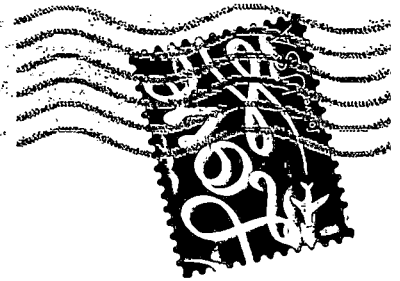
