


ORDER


By order dated June 13, 2017, the notice of appeal in this matter was dismissed based on petitioner's failure to show an arguable basis for asserting the determination of the lower court was improper. *See* Rule 243(c), SCACR. The remittitur was sent on June 29, 2017. *See* Rule 221(b), SCACR (The remittitur shall not be sent to the lower court or administrative tribunal until fifteen days have elapsed since the filing of the order of the court finally disposing of the appeal.). A petition for rehearing was received on June 30, 2017, in an envelope showing it was delivered to the Kershaw Correctional Institution Mailroom on June 29, 2017, and that it was postmarked the same day. By order dated July 20, 2017, the petition was stricken and dismissed due to the Court's lack of jurisdiction. *See Wise v. S.C. Dept. of Corr.*, 372 S.C. 173, 642 S.E.2d 551 (2007).


Petitioner has filed a request for reconsideration in which he requests the Court accept his petition for rehearing or grant him an extension of time. Because the remittitur was properly sent, depriving this Court of further jurisdiction over the case, the request for reconsideration be dismissed. *See Wise, supra.*
