

ORDER


By order dated June 13, 2017, the notice of appeal in this matter was dismissed based on petitioner's failure to show an arguable basis for asserting the determination of the lower court was improper. *See* Rule 243(c), SCACR. The remittitur was sent on June 29, 2017. *See* Rule 221(b), SCACR (The remittitur shall not be sent to the lower court or administrative tribunal until fifteen days have elapsed since the filing of the order of the court finally disposing of the appeal.). A petition for rehearing was received on June 30, 2017. Because the remittitur was properly sent, this Court no longer has jurisdiction over the case and can take no action on the petition. *See* *Wise v. S.C. Dept. of Corr.*, 372 S.C. 173, 642 S.E.2d 551 (2007). The petition for rehearing is therefore dismissed.


