MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE PETITION FOR WRIT OF
CERTIORARI AND APPENDIX

Counsel for appellant respectfully requests an extension of thirty (30) days in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a second request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix are due to be served and filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel for appellant respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage his caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.

Counsel filed the Petition for Writ of Certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Eric Shanta Williams v. State with this Court on August 16, 2017. Counsel filed the reply to return to petition for writ of certiorari in the case of Joseph Pettigrew Sanders, IV, v. State with this Court on August 8, 2017. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of In the Matter of the Care and Treatment of Melvin Beam with the Court of Appeals on August 7, 2017. Counsel filed the petition for rehearing in the case of State v. Lorenzo Bernard Young with the Court of Appeals on August 3, 2017. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of State v. Reco Ramone Felder with the Court of Appeals on August 2, 2017.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office has been informed of this request.


WHEREFORE, the undersigned counsel would respectfully request a thirty day extension, in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in this case based upon the above exigent circumstances. Counsel requests that time limits for filing the petition be held in abeyance pending a ruling on this motion.




