
Dear Mr. McKelvey:

The Court received your correspondence with proof of service dated October 13, 2017. Your correspondence is presumed to be a response to the Court's letter of October 5, 2017. Your correspondence is not sufficient to be considered an appellant's initial brief, designation of matter, or motion to file out of time because it is not compliant with Rules 208, 209 and 240, SCACR. Rule 208 sets forth the content we expect to see in your initial brief, which should include the headings set forth in Rule 208(b)(1) and citation to legal authority. Rule 209 requires you to clearly identify the documents that the Court will need to review when considering the legal arguments in the brief. Please note the types of documents permitted to be included in the record on the appeal as set forth in Rule 209(b), as well as the certification by you that nothing is designated that is irrelevant to the appeal in Rule 209(c).

You must file a corrected initial brief, designation of matter, and a motion to file out-of-time within twenty (20) days of the date of this letter or your appeal will be dismissed. The filing fee that you have already provided (receipt number 84830) will be applied to the corrected motion to file the appellant's initial brief and

designation of matter out-of-time.
