ORDER

Appellants have filed a notice of appeal from the Workers' Compensation Commission Appellate Panel's (Appellate Panel) order that dismissed their appeal as interlocutory. Respondent has filed a motion to dismiss, arguing the Appellate Panel's order is not immediately appealable. Because the Appellate Panel's order does not "dispose of the whole subject matter of [this] action or terminate [this] action, leaving nothing to be done but to enforce what has already been determined," it is not a final judgment. *Bone v. U.S. Food Serv.*, Op. No. 27153 (S.C. Sup. Ct. filed Aug. 1, 2012) (Shearouse Adv.Sh. No. 26 at 121).

Accordingly, Respondent's motion is granted because the Appellate Panel's order is not immediately appealable. *See Bone v. U.S. Food Serv.*, Op. No. 27153 (S.C. Sup. Ct. filed Aug. 1, 2012) (Shearouse Adv.Sh. No. 26 at 123) (noting appeals under the Administrative Procedures Act are generally limited to final judgments).
