

I have multiple arguable basis that are issues preserved for an appeal. Where they found my right handprint on the door above the handle also was my left handprint. This indicates that I frequently attend this business, or that I used both hands to open the door the time I attended the business. The video clearly shows the suspect exiting the store using only his right hand to open the door. I advised my lawyer and told her to put in a "Motion to Suppress Evidence" for pre-trial motions, but she didn't. My attorney Melisa W. Gray and I both have copies of the letter I sent telling her to do so. Lt. Micheal Roach "said" that I admitted to committing the crime, but doesn't have an written or recorded statement of me doing so. That is mere hearsay and is inadmissible by law. I also told my attorney in the letter to put in an "Motion to Suppress Evidence" due to the fact that there is no written or recorded statement of an admission, but she didn't. Investigators found a gun and a few clothing from the crime a few yards from the crime scene, but have no DNA or fingerprints linking me to any of it. When a warrant was put out to search my current address at the time they found shoes similar to the ones on the video of the crime. Me and five others are residents of this property and there are no way to prove those shoes belong to me. Owner of the house is an liable witness of my whereabouts on the night of the incident, which she clearly states she went to sleep with me in her bedroom and woke up with me there also. My attorney and I both have a copy of me telling her to put in a "Motion to Suppress Evidence", a "Motion for judgement as a matter of Law", and "Motion in LIMINE". My motions were not put in from my attorney on the inadmissible evidence based above. I will shortly be sending the transcript of my motion to relieve counsel being denied during trial.

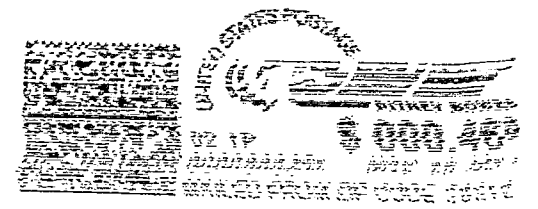
