Now comes Ronald L. Legg, Appellant, before this honorable Court in pleading for leave of the Court to reinstate upon good cause shown, after notice to all parties, in accordance with Rule 260 SCACR.


Appellant is an inmate at the Evans Correctional Institution, under the authority of Respondent in this case. (S.C.D.C.), which has imposed undue hardship, through interference, by repetitious institutional lock downs that have infringed upon the free course for responding to legal matters, in an unobstructed access to law library, and time mannered discipline, which has occurred, and continues to, during period of correspondence between Appellant and the Court that has apparently had an adverse effect upon Appellant's right to access to the Court by absence

of state obstruction, regardless of any mitigating factors proffered by Respondent.

Appellant did respond to Clerk's initial letter dated October 25, 2017 by correcting deficiency according to the suggestion, and in the best of Appellant's ability, and due diligence under the prevailing circumstances from Respondent's impositions, which show cause and prejudice against Appellant for pursuing his right to have important issues regarding principle and rule of law under state and federal constitutions heard, for dissolving continuing issue of controversy.

Appellant is responding to Court's Order To Dismiss, dated November 13, 2017 for reinstatement of appeal.

Appellant respectfully ask this Court to reinstate Appellate No. 2017-002215, because of the importance of the issues of law governing the case, and the relevance of unfair prejudice, whereby, Respondent participates in the monopolization of state powers which have infringed upon Appellant's right to due process pursuant to South Carolina Constitution Art 1 § 3, and the 5<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> Amendments of the United States Constitution.
