ORDER

This appeal was dismissed due to Appellant's failure to serve and file a Designation of Matter. On February 17, 2012, this Court sent Appellant a letter indicating that in order for his appeal to be reinstated, Appellant had to file a petition to reinstate, file a "Corrected Appellant's Initial Brief" that did not include changes to the content of his brief, and file a Designation of Matter. Appellant has now served and filed an amended Designation of Matter, a petition to reinstate this appeal, an amended Appellant's Initial Brief, and a motion to change and add content to his initial brief. Respondent did not file any returns. After careful consideration, Appellant's motion to change and add content to his initial brief is denied. Within ten days, Appellant shall serve and file a "Corrected Appellant's Initial Brief" that complies with this Court's February 17, 2012 letter. This Court will act on Appellant's petition to reinstate upon receipt of the "Corrected Appellant's Initial Brief" or the expiration of ten days.
