Dear Counsel:

The Court received your letter indicating your appeal includes a constitutional issue. Pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. §14-8-200(b)(3) (2017) and Rule 203(d)(1)(A)(ii) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR), the Supreme Court has exclusive jurisdiction over a "final judgment involving a challenge on state or federal grounds to the constitutionality of a state law or county or municipal ordinance where the principal issue is one of the constitutionality of the law or ordinance. . . ." At this time, we do not have sufficient information to make a determination of whether the principle issue on appeal is one of constitutionality. If you would like, you also have the option of filing a request with the Supreme Court to certify your appeal pursuant to Rule 204(b), SCACR.
