PETITION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME  
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT  
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Carrie Callaham petitions the Court for a thirty day extension, in which to file the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in this case. In support of this petition, counsel shows:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter are due to be filed with the Court today. This is the thirty extension for Ms. Callaham.
2. Counsel for Ms. Callaham respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Counsel understands that in the previous extension request, she indicated that would be a final, however, given the number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.

3. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Roman Millen was filed on December 13, 2012. Counsel filed the return to petition for writ of certiorari in State v. Daniel Jenkins on December 7, 2012. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Frankie McGee and had an oral argument in State v. Timothy Wallace on December 5, 2012. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Donte Reid on November 26, 2012. On November 15, 2012, counsel had an oral argument in the South Carolina Supreme Court in State v. Mark Baker. On November 9, 2012, counsel filed the Anders brief of appellant and record on appeal in State v. Timothy Young. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Alirio Ortiz in the Supreme Court on November 5, 2012.




5. As indicated by signature below, Salley Elliott, of the South Carolina Attorney General's Office, does not oppose this request.
