

## AMENDED ORDER

---

In the explanation required by Rule 243(c) of South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR), petitioner has failed to show that there is an arguable basis for asserting that the determination by the lower court was improper. Accordingly, this matter is dismissed. The remittitur will be sent as provided by Rule 221(b), SCACR.

In addition, because petitioner has filed six applications for post-conviction relief, all of which have been denied, by letter dated May 15, 2017, petitioner was given fifteen days to inform this Court of any reasons why certain restrictions on future filings should not be imposed. Petitioner has failed to provide any such reasons. Accordingly, we hereby prohibit petitioner from filing any further collateral actions in the circuit court, including post-conviction relief actions and habeas corpus actions, as well as any motions relating to the previously filed collateral actions, challenging his 1993 convictions for murder and assault and battery with intent to kill without first obtaining permission to do so from this Court.
