Personally appear before me, a magistrate of this county one, Detective Eric Tuttle, who first being duly sworn deposed and says that, Montrelle Lamont Campbell, did within this county and state on the September 19th 2015 violate the criminal laws of the State of South Carolina in the following particular:

DESCRIPTION OF OFFENSE

Attempted Murder
(16-3-29)

The affiant states there is probable cause to believe that the defendant named did commit the crime set forth and that such probable cause is based on the following facts:

That on September 19, 2015 at 6:35 a.m. while at 36-A Norman Street in the City of Charleston, South Carolina, the defendant did with malice aforethought violate South Carolina Statute 16-3-10 (Murder) to wit:

That on the above date and time the Charleston Police Department responded to a shooting at 36-A Norman Street, within the Gadsden Green Complex, and discovered co-victim ANTWAN FROST unresponsive on the floor of the apartment. Mr. Frost was transported to MUSC Hospital where he was pronounced dead from a single gunshot wound. The VICTIM, Tierra Brown, sustained gunshot wound to her right forearm. The co-victim, Kerri Brown, received a minor gunshot wound to her head. Multiple .223 shell casings were discovered on the ground outside of the apartment along with multiple bullet holes which penetrated the windows and doors of the apartment.

Charleston Police Detectives interviewed witnesses and learned that a house party had taken place at the incident location on September 18, 2015. During this party, resident Katrina Brown was punched and knocked to the ground by a subject known to her as "Troll". The CPD Criminal Intelligence Unit identified the moniker "Troll" to be commonly used by Montrelle Campbell. Katrina Brown positively identified Montrelle Campbell from a photograph as being her assailant. Katrina Brown also stated that the assault may have been a motivating factor for the shooting on September 19, 2015.



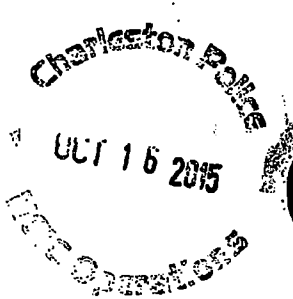


Video surveillance footage obtained by CPD investigators recorded the following events on September 19, 2015:

- 1) At 6:18 a.m. a 4-door sedan drives west on Nunan Street, a one-way street and stops before reaching President Street. The driver of the sedan is observed throwing a lit cigarette from the sedan onto Nunan Street. The driver then parked the vehicle facing the wrong direction on Nunan Street.
- 2) After the vehicle is parked, the driver accompanied by Andrew Smith-Rivers, are observed walking to President Street and turning south toward the incident location. It is noted that numerous CPD detectives were able to readily identify Andrew Smith-Rivers from this surveillance video. At 6:20 a.m. the driver and Andrew Smith-Rivers are observed walking into the Gadsden Green Complex.
- 3) At 6:29 a.m. multiple gun shots are fired into the incident location.
- 4) At 6:30 a.m. the driver is observed on video running from the Gadsden Green Complex, north on President Street. At 6:30:36 the driver is observed walking onto Nunan Street and re-entering the sedan.
- 5) At this time another black male is observed running from the incident location carrying a black firearm similar in appearance to an AR-15 rifle, capable of firing .223 bullets. This subject walked east on Nunan Street toward the sedan now occupied by the driver. It is noted that this subject has a light complexion and manicured beard. It is further noted this subject is not Andrew Smith-Rivers.
- 6) Surveillance video shows no other pedestrians in the vicinity of the sedan other than those described here-in.
- 7) At 6:31 a.m. the sedan is seen leaving Nunan Street in the wrong direction at a high rate of speed.

The aforesaid cigarette butt seen thrown from the sedan by the driver was collected by CPD Crime Scene Technicians and submitted for DNA analysis. A DNA profile was developed which identified Trivell Richardson (b/m, 11/22/84). During a post-Miranda Warning interview Trivell Richardson admitted being in the area during the shooting and smoking and discarding a cigarette. Further, that a search warrant executed in reference to Trivell Richardson's cell phone provided documentation that his cell phone was also in the vicinity of the crime scene during the time of the murder.

These cell phone records also show contact between Trivell Richardson and Montrelle Campbell, the previously described assailant of Katrina Brown. A search warrant executed on Montrelle Campbell's phone shows it was in the vicinity of the crime scene at the time of the murder. Further investigation revealed that Montrelle Campbell's current girlfriend Tomeka President is the owner of a 2004 Buick Century, SC tag 518-2FW, matching the description of the vehicle observed in the surveillance video. During an interview with CPD detectives Ms. President stated she was with Montrelle Campbell the night prior to the murder but woke up the morning of September 19, 2015 to discover both her Buick Century and Montrelle Campbell missing. Ms. President stated only Montrelle Campbell would have had access to her vehicle at that time.

By establishing a motive for the shooting, identifying the vehicle driven by Trivell Richardson, Tomeka President's statement, and through cell phone records and video surveillance, detectives have established a tangible link between Trivell Richardson and the defendant MONTRELLE CAMPBELL and 36-A Norman Street. Through these associations and above stated facts the affiant believes sufficient probable cause exists to show that Montrelle Campbell participated in the commission of the murder as he has access to Tomeka's Buick Century which is parked moments before the shooting. After the gunshots, a black male who closely resembles Montrelle Campbell is seen on video carrying a rifle to the Buick. The gunman climbs into the Buick with Trivell and they drive the wrong way down Nunan Street and leave the area.

The coordinated and calculated actions of this murder could have resulted in the sudden and violent death of the victim, Tierra Brown.

The above is true and believable based on the incident as reported by Katrina Brown, Kerri Brown, the statement of Tomeka President, the statement of Trivell Richardson, and the investigations by the Charleston Police Department.

AFFIDAVIT

Personally appear before me, a magistrate of this county one, Detective Eric Tuttle, who first being duly sworn deposed and says that, Montrelle Lamont Campbell, did within this county and state on the September 19th 2015 violate the criminal laws of the State of South Carolina in the following particular:

DESCRIPTION OF OFFENSE

Attempted Murder
(16-3-29)

The affiant states there is probable cause to believe that the defendant named did commit the crime set forth and that such probable cause is based on the following facts:

That on September 19, 2015 at 6:35 a.m. while at 36-A Norman Street in the City of Charleston, South Carolina, the defendant did with malice aforethought violate South Carolina Statute 16-3-10 (Murder) to wit:

That on the above date and time the Charleston Police Department responded to a shooting at 36-A Norman Street, within the Gadsden Green Complex, and discovered co-victim ANTWAN FROST unresponsive on the floor of the apartment. Mr. Frost was transported to MUSC Hospital where he was pronounced dead from a single gunshot wound. The VICTIM, Kerri Brown, received a minor gunshot wound to her head. The co-victim, Tierra Brown, sustained gunshot wound to her right forearm. Multiple .223 shell casings were discovered on the ground outside of the apartment along with multiple bullet holes which penetrated the windows and doors of the apartment.

Charleston Police Detectives interviewed witnesses and learned that a house party had taken place at the incident location on September 18, 2015. During this party, resident Katrina Brown was punched and knocked to the ground by a subject known to her as "Troll". The CPD Criminal Intelligence Unit identified the moniker "Troll" to be commonly used by Montrelle Campbell. Katrina Brown positively identified Montrelle Campbell from a photograph as being her assailant. Katrina Brown also stated that the assault may have been a motivating factor for the shooting on September 19, 2015.



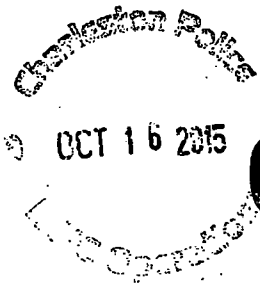

AFFIDAVIT


Video surveillance footage obtained by CPD investigators recorded the following events on September 19, 2015:

- 1) At 6:18 a.m. a 4-door sedan drives west on Nunan Street, a one-way street and stops before reaching President Street. The driver of the sedan is observed throwing a lit cigarette from the sedan onto Nunan Street. The driver then parked the vehicle facing the wrong direction on Nunan Street.
- 2) After the vehicle is parked, the driver accompanied by Andrew Smith-Rivers, are observed walking to President Street and turning south toward the incident location. It is noted that numerous CPD detectives were able to readily identify Andrew Smith-Rivers from this surveillance video. At 6:20 a.m. the driver and Andrew Smith-Rivers are observed walking into the Gadsden Green Complex.
- 3) At 6:29 a.m. multiple gun shots are fired into the incident location.
- 4) At 6:30 a.m. the driver is observed on video running from the Gadsden Green Complex, north on President Street. At 6:30:36 the driver is observed walking onto Nunan Street and re-entering the sedan.
- 5) At this time another black male is observed running from the incident location carrying a black firearm similar in appearance to an AR-15 rifle, capable of firing .223 bullets. This subject walked east on Nunan Street toward the sedan now occupied by the driver. It is noted that this subject has a light complexion and manicured beard. It is further noted this subject is not Andrew Smith-Rivers.
- 6) Surveillance video shows no other pedestrians in the vicinity of the sedan other than those described here-in.
- 7) At 6:31 a.m. the sedan is seen leaving Nunan Street in the wrong direction at a high rate of speed.

The aforesaid cigarette butt seen thrown from the sedan by the driver was collected by CPD Crime Scene Technicians and submitted for DNA analysis. A DNA profile was developed which identified Trivell Richardson (b/m, 11/22/84). During a post-Miranda Warning interview Trivell Richardson admitted being in the area during the shooting and smoking and discarding a cigarette. Further, that a search warrant executed in reference to Trivell Richardson's cell phone provided documentation that his cell phone was also in the vicinity of the crime scene during the time of the murder.

These cell phone records also show contact between Trivell Richardson and Montrelle Campbell, the previously described assailant of Katrina Brown. A search warrant executed on Montrelle Campbell's phone shows it was in the vicinity of the crime scene at the time of the murder. Further investigation revealed that Montrelle Campbell's current girlfriend Tomeka President is the owner of a 2004 Buick Century, SC tag 518-2FW, matching the description of the vehicle observed in the surveillance video. During an interview with CPD detectives Ms. President stated she was with Montrelle Campbell the night prior to the murder but woke up the morning of September 19, 2015 to discover both her Buick Century and Montrelle Campbell missing. Ms. President stated only Montrelle Campbell would have had access to her vehicle at that time.

By establishing a motive for the shooting, identifying the vehicle driven by Trivell Richardson, Tomeka President's statement, and through cell phone records and video surveillance, detectives have established a tangible link between Trivell Richardson and the defendant MONTRELLE CAMPBELL and 36-A Norman Street. Through these associations and above stated facts the affiant believes sufficient probable cause exists to show that Montrelle Campbell participated in the commission of the murder as he has access to Tomeka's Buick Century which is parked moments before the shooting. After the gunshots, a black male who closely resembles Montrelle Campbell is seen on video carrying a rifle to the Buick. The gunman climbs into the Buick with Trivell and they drive the wrong way down Nunan Street and leave the area.

The coordinated and calculated actions of this murder could have resulted in the sudden and violent death of the victim, Kerri Brown.

The above is true and believable based on the incident as reported by Katrina Brown, Kerri Brown, the statement of Tomeka President, the statement of Trivell Richardson, and the investigations by the Charleston Police Department. CW
