MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Antwon Pierre Baker respectfully requests a **final extension of twenty-two (22) days, until March 14, 2018**, in which to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case. **Counsel will file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter before the deadline if possible.** This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter are due to be filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel for Antwon Pierre Baker respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the



number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage his caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.


3. **Counsel was out of the office for a week with a confirmed case of Type A flu, and he is still catching up on his already very heavy workload.** Counsel had an oral argument in the case of The State v. Jeffrey Dana Andrews heard in this Court on February 14, 2018. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the murder case of The State v. Horace Elijah Watts with this Court on February 12, 2018. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the attempted murder case of The State v. Joshua Maiden with this Court on February 9, 2018. Counsel had an oral argument in the case of The State v. Richard Krochmal heard in this Court on February 6, 2018. Counsel filed the petition for rehearing in the case of The State v. Christina Reece with this Court on January 24, 2018. Counsel filed the brief of petitioner in the case of The State v. Jalann Williams with the Supreme Court on January 16, 2018. Counsel, along with co-counsel, David Alexander, filed the reply of petitioner to the Supreme Court of the United States in the death penalty case of The State v. Ricky Lee Blackwell on January 11, 2018. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Willie Gray with this Court on January 5, 2018. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Carlos Ruiz with this Court on December 29, 2017. **Counsel has extensive administrative duties as the Chief Appellate Defender, including administrative and Appellate Project oversight, and training two less experienced appellate defenders.**

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload

will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.


5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request shown by signature below.
