ORDER

These two post-conviction relief cases were apparently merged before the circuit court. The final order is dated June 5, 2017, and was filed with the clerk of the circuit court on July 5, 2017.¹ The public case index for Horry County indicates that petitioner is represented by Matthew Martin McGuire, Esquire.

Petitioner has filed a *pro se* document dated January 1, 2018, which is entitled "Appeal to Final Order." This document has been construed as a notice of appeal under Rule 243 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR).

Petitioner has failed to provide a proof of service showing that a copy of this notice of appeal has been timely served on opposing counsel as required by Rules 243(b) and 203(d)(1)(B)(i), SCACR, and has failed to provide this Court with the explanation required by Rule 243(c), SCACR. Accordingly, the notice of appeal is

dismissed.² The remittitur will be sent as provided by Rule 221(b), SCACR.
