ORDER

By order dated December 5, 2017, the South Carolina Court of Appeals dismissed the appeal in this matter. On January 11, 2018, the Court of Appeals denied a petition for reinstatement, and subsequently sent the remittitur to the administrative law court on February 16, 2018.¹

Petitioner has now filed a petition for a writ of certiorari dated February 16, 2018. This petition is dismissed for several reasons.


First, the petition is untimely under Rule 242(c) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR). Second, petitioner has failed to either pay the filing fee required by Rule 242(c), SCACR, or file a motion seeking a waiver of that filing fee from this Court.


Finally, and most importantly, when petitioner failed to timely file a petition for a writ of certiorari with this Court, the Court of Appeals properly sent the remittitur to the administrative law court. Rule 221(b), SCACR. The sending of the remittitur ended appellate jurisdiction, and no further motions or petitions can be considered regarding this case. *Wise v. S.C. Dept. of Corr.*, 372 S.C. 173, 642

Accordingly, the petition for a writ of certiorari is dismissed.
