Re: Charlie L. Jones v. Kirby Shealy, III, et. Al.

The Honorable Ms. Kitchings:

I am writing to update you on the above transcript request. In my latest correspondence with Mr. Jones dated February 14, 2018, he writes a postal employee informed him the transcript I mailed to him was being returned to sender. The day I received his letter I tracked the transcript online with USPS tracking -- a copy of which is attached -- where it shows delivery could not be made on February 16, 2018 so it was being returned to sender. I take that to mean that another delivery was attempted on February 16 at 4:00 p.m., but could not be effectuated, again. To date, February 22, 2018 the transcript has not been returned to me by the Postal Service.

His letter also states, "You have to be in the city to sign for the package." I can only deliver to what address he has provided me. If he does not live there, he has not provided me with a different address. Also, when a certified mail notice is left at the address notifying the resident they have a piece of mail, they are able to schedule a re-delivery or schedule a pickup time online.

I don't know wherein the problem lies in this situation, but I know I have done all I can do on my end to provide him with the transcript. I will wait on further instructions from Court Administration regarding this matter and will not correspond with Mr. Jones anymore as his letters have become accusatory and threatening.

RE: LETTER DATED FEBRUARY 8, 2018:

Dear Ms. Ray,

I received your latest correspondence on February 13th, and went immediately to the Sumter County Postal Service to pick up the package you claimed you were told by the Florence Postal Service was waiting for me to pick up. This time I had an actual *POSTMASTER, Mr. James A. Harrell*, he look for the package for about thirty minutes, out front and in the rear of facility, and afterward did a search on their computers. The results were that the package was returned to *SENDER* on December 20, 2017 (see attached). I cannot argue or debate with US Postal Service Employees, when they have supplied me with the records that they have.

I can see that you are getting frustrated regarding this matter. However, this tracking process has to begin and end with you and the US Postal Service. I am following the lawful process of trying to track this package. Therefore, I will not allow you to blame me for any incompetents of Postal Employees, or anyone else that may have came in contact with these transcripts, nor will I be distracted from what I must do regarding this case. Is it possible that the transcripts may have been misplaced upon being returned from the US Postal Service?

Additionally, I have been submitting proof to all parties, of what are being said to me by the US Postal Service, you and myself. I have not seen any proof to back up what you have been saying, other than the tracking numbers of the package that the *US Postal Service, d b a Postmaster Mr. James A. Harrell*, said were returned to *SENDER* on *December 20, 2017* (see attachment).

Regarding delivery of certified mail, one has to be in the city to sign for the package. I am requesting that you research any and all packages that you sent out by Certified Mail, and see if any packages were returned, and see if the transcripts are among them, if so, please let me

know.

Whoever you feel is the responsible, I submit that if the transcripts are not received by March 5, 2018, I will file a *Motion for Order, with the SC Appeals Court*, ordering you and or the *Lower Court* to turn over these transcripts. I will present all the evidence I can obtain, and leave the decision in the hands of the South Carolina Appeals Court.

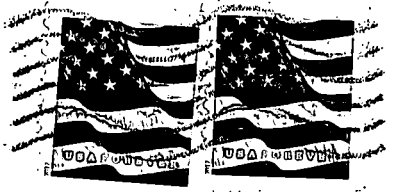
