This responds to your recent letters dated March 5, 2018.

Enclosed is an order of this Court specifying the cost of copying and mailing. As you will see, the fact that you may be indigent is irrelevant as to whether the fees will be waived.

There are various available resources that are available to find relevant South Carolina case law and other legal documents. I have enclosed a memorandum outlining those resources.

While we do not publish any paper document containing the rules of this Court, several vendors do so. Further, all of the court rules in this state are available at www.sccourts.org/courtreg and should also be available to you in your prison library.

Since the Declaration of Independence and the State and Federal Constitutions are not records of this Court, I decline to provide you with a copy of these documents. I note that the State and Federal Constitutions are available on the South Carolina General Assembly's website, www.scstatehouse.net, and should also be available to you in your prison library. Finally, a transcript of the Declaration of Independence is available on various websites including www.archives.gov/founding-docs/declaration-transcript.

Since the three extensions that have been granted to the State in Appellate Case Number 2017-000755 only comprise three pages, I have enclosed a copy of those documents without requiring the filing fee and mailing fee to be paid. I do call your attention to the fact that all of the documents filed in this case are available on the public access version of our appellate court case management system at www.sccourts.org/ACMS/index.cfm.
