Dear Bright:

This responds to your letter dated March 20, 2018. The remittitur is simply the document that signals the end of appellate jurisdiction over a case. Rule 221(b) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR); *Wise v. S.C. Dept. of Corr.*, 372 S.C. 173, 642 S.E.2d 551 (2007). The sending of the remittitur in this case means that this Court's order dated February 2, 2018, which dismissed this appellate case based on your failure to provide an adequate explanation under Rule 243(c), SCACR, is the final judgment of this Court.

Since the court of common pleas denied your application for post-conviction relief and the judgment of this Court did not reverse that ruling by the circuit court, I am not aware of any further actions that will occur in the circuit court regarding your application for post-conviction relief. You may want to discuss this matter with Mr. Boozer.
