ORDER

First, Respondent's motion to strike Appellant's final brief is granted. Pursuant to Rule 211(b), SCACR, final briefs must be identical to initial briefs except for the correction of typographical errors and the inclusion of references to the record. Because Appellant's final brief is substantially different from Appellant's initial brief, the final brief is stricken. Within thirty days of the date of this order, Appellant shall serve and file a final Appellant's brief that is identical to the initial brief, with the exception of the correction of typographical errors and the inclusion of references to the record.

Second, Respondent's motion regarding the record on appeal is granted to the extent that Appellant shall serve and file a supplemental record on appeal that includes the matters designated by the parties but omitted from the record previously served. Within thirty days from the date of this order, Appellant shall serve and file a supplemental record on appeal that includes only: (1) Appellant's eight sentencing sheets; (2) the Conviction Summary from SCDC's Offender Management System, and (3) the Inmate Offense History from SCDC's Offender Management System. As for Respondent's complaints regarding pagination of the served record, Respondent may cite to the original record using the pagination in the record available on the South Carolina Appellate Case Management System.
