REPLY TO CORRESPONDENCE OF JESSICA L. CROWLEY

Dear Ms. Kitchings,

We are sending this brief reply due to the late hour. If the court requires additional and/or more formal briefing, We will so respond. The exigency in this case is not based merely on the timing of the April 3, 2018 order, but it is based on the substantive law which creates an injustice in this case and leaves the property and assets of Alice Shaw Baker unprotected. The representations in Ms. Crowley's letter are factually and legally in error.

The criteria for emergency review of the writ of supersedeas are:

“it clearly appears from specific facts shown by affidavits or included in the verified petition that immediate and irreparable injury, loss or damage will result before the opposing party can respond.”

The writ and affidavits specifically states that Respondent admittedly can not get a bond, and transfer of monies have already taken place without opportunity to object. This is improper, and will leave the estate unprotected and Appellant Lisa Fisher without an opportunity to orderly transfer to any proper person and have a fair trial.

Here is a case where the foundation for the judgment and orders are corrupt. Judge Hughston's actions were merely to discredit Appellants without providing any factual basis for his claims. This gave him the basis to deliver the property to Respondents, without protecting the assets through stay, bond, or protection of the deposit in the court. By so doing, with knowledge of Appellants' right to bring a motion and to seek judicial review, Appellants were left without legal recourse. While Respondents and Judge Hughston do not seem to approve of judicial review, it is

our legal right and it is what makes the system work. We are merely asking for this protection.

With regard to the timing of bringing the Rule 59 motions, Ms. Crowley knows or should know that under subsection e, Appellants had 10 days after “receipt of **written notice of the entry of the order.**” Even Judge Hughston does not represent in his attachment email dated April 9, 2018 that Appellants received the order on March 22, 2018. He states it would have been available online on March 22, 2018. As represented in the Notice of Appeal, Appellants did not receive the written notice until March 26, 2018. Therefore, the ten day period would have been April 6, 2018. The order precluding filing in the Circuit court is April 3, 2018.

However, as a final note, the attachment by Ms. Crowley of notification on March 22, 2018 means she received notice prior to Appellants. It does not mean, and Appellants did not receive written notice at any earlier time. Her attachment does not show service on Appellants, only to “Jacicrowley.”

This is an emergency, and release of the real property and personal property should not take place when there are questions. Appellants ask at least that the court allow a temporary stay, so that you can consider the formal petition.
