MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE PETITION FOR WRIT OF


1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix are due to be served and filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel for Randall Earl Sightler respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage his caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.

State with this Court on March 19, 2018. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of In the Matter of the Care and Treatment of Micah A. Bilton with the Court of Appeals on March 19, 2018. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of State v. David Richard Walker, Jr. with the Court of Appeals on March 19, 2018. Counsel filed the Petition for Rehearing in the case of State v. Gerald R. Williams with the Court of Appeals on March 13, 2018. Counsel filed the Petition for Writ of Certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Arthur Ray Chavis v. State with this Court on February 26, 2018.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.
5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office has been informed of this request.




