

Have you heard of force majeure? I discovered this idea in my book-contracts. Force majeure annuls the ordinary limitations and requirements of contracts and law. Men in this prison have been walking around with swords jutting from their belts for the last eight months. About ten percent of our population has gone out to the hospital, and the simpler assaults are beyond counting. This is an environment where ordinary life and expectations don't function: force majeure.

And this situation is a consequence of actions by the Respondent. I need more time, and I need my time to begin when the force majeure ends.
