Assisted living employee charged with attempted rape at facility

ORANGEBURG, SC (WIS) - An employee of an assisted living facility in Orangeburg has been charged with trying to rape a mentally handicapped resident.

An Orangeburg city judge set bond at \$25,000 on charges of criminal sexual assault for 64-year-old Ralph C. Williams, Sr. of Orangeburg.

Capt. Mike Adams of the Orangeburg Department of Public Safety said officials at UNHouth on Whilman Street have cooperated with law enforcement.

When officers arrived, they took Williams into custody.

An employee told investigators that she could not find Williams. According to the police report, around 3 a.m. she went into the room of a 42-year-old female patient and saw Williams "on the bed that (the patient) was in, she saw Mr. Williams climbing on top of (the patient) as she lay on her back in her bed."

According to the report, Williams has his "scrub pants down and appeared to be starting to have sex with (the patient)."

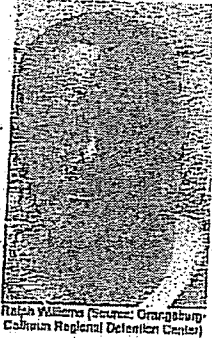
When she asked Williams what he was doing, he told her to shut the door.

She found another employee and went back to this room. The two employees found Williams straightening out his clothes.

Investigators tried communicating with the mentally and physically handicapped victim, but did not get very detailed information. When asked how old she was, the victim said, "Five."

The investigation is ongoing.

Ralph Williams (Source: Orangeburg-Columbia Regional Detention Center)

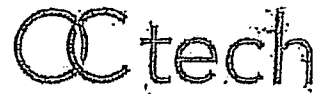


