ORDER

Appellants have filed a petition for a writ of supersedeas and emergency interim relief, claiming they would suffer irreparable harm and be deprived of their right to a meaningful appeal absent the writ. I hereby stay all orders and proceedings in all cases related to the estate of Alice Shaw-Baker so as to allow the Court time to consider the merits of the petition for a writ of supersedeas. I also order all estate assets—cash, real property, or otherwise—to be returned to the custody of Lisa Fisher, as she is bonded and is best able to protect the estate assets until final resolution of this petition.¹

¹ In the petition for a writ of supersedeas, Appellants claimed respondents are now in possession of over \$236,000 in cash as a result of the circuit court's order that the bank transfer the estate's accounts into respondents' care, despite respondents' lack of a bond.
