## ORDER

---

On May 24, 2018, I ordered a stay of all orders and proceedings in all cases related to the estate of Alice Shaw-Baker so as to allow the Court time to consider the merits of a petition for a writ of supersedeas filed by Appellants. I also ordered all estate assets to be returned to the custody of appellant Lisa Fisher because she is bonded, whereas respondents are not.<sup>1</sup>

With the consent of Lisa Fisher, I hereby modify the May 24th order. I now order all real and personal property belonging to the estate to be returned to the custody of Lisa Fisher. In addition, I order respondent Kay Passailaigue Slade to return the money she has in the amount of \$105,025.14 to the Charleston County Clerk of Court. I likewise order Judge Thomas L. Hughston to deposit the check from the ended conservatorship of Alice Shaw-Baker with the Charleston County Clerk of Court in a separate account. Any other monetary assets belonging to the estate should be turned over to the Charleston County Clerk of Court as well, and all money will be held by the Clerk pending the appeal and further order of this Court. The previously ordered stay remains in place.
