
Dear Sir:

As you are aware, I've requested for the Appellate Case No. 2017-001904, to be dismissed without prejudice, if you were in agreement for the same. Be that as it may, I've acquired information revealing §24-21-10(F)(1), and §24-21-5(2), of SC Code Ann., pursuant by law require an actuarial risk and needs assessment examination be performed by a qualified psychologist or psychiatrist, and not by someone who was not a licensed psychologist or psychiatrist.

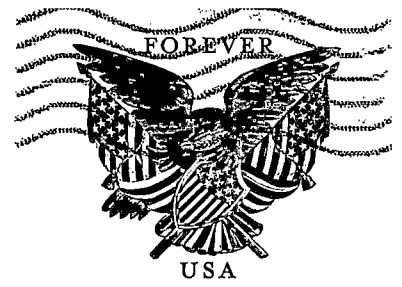
