This matter comes before the Court by way of an application for post-conviction relief (PCR) filed December 29, 2015. Respondent made its Return and Motion to Dismiss on October 20, 2016, requesting the application be summarily dismissed based upon (1) the presumption against successive applications; and (2) the expiration of the statute of limitations.


A hearing over the State's Motion to Dismiss was held on April 19, 2017. Applicant was present and represented by James H. Price, III, Esquire. Respondent was represented by Assistant Attorney General DeShawn H. Mitchell, Esquire.

This Court finds that Applicant has failed to meet his burden in proving that he is entitled to a full hearing on the merits of his application for post-conviction relief. This Court finds this application is untimely filed and is successive to his previous applications. Therefore, Respondent's Motion to Dismiss is granted, and this this application is summarily dismissed with prejudice.
