While awaiting the date I was stopped by a traffic officer that explained that my license was up for suspension in 2 weeks and that I needed to contact D.M.V. I did and they explained to me that they received information from the Administrative Law Court saying that my license should be suspended because I'm a habitual offender. When I called the court they explained to me that they dismissed my case in my absence because I didn't respond in time to the information they sent both me and my attorney Mr. Joe McCullah. Well two things are wrong here... First I didn't receive anything pertaining to my case and secondly I don't know who Joe McCullah is! I did some research and got in touch with him. I asked him about this situation and neither did he receive anything or have knowledge concerning this case. Shortly afterwards I received an order denying my motion for reconsideration.
