

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MOTION TO REINSTATE APPEAL

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Appellant moves before this court with MOTION TO REINSTATE APPEAL, based on extraordinary circumstances that were beyond the Appellant's control from December 5, 2017 to July 5, 2018.

1. This case was dismissed by the South Carolina Court of Appeals on May 30, 2018, for what Appellant believed that the court felt that Appellant's failure to file his Initial Brief and Record on Appeal, were done purposely (*See Exhibit A*).

2. Appellant believe this case was dismissed because after approximately eight (8) months, Appellant did not receive the transcript mailed to him from the Court Reporter. Appellant believe the Appeals Court believed he had, or should have had the transcript.
3. Appellant received the transcript for the first time on July 5, 2018, by meeting the Court Reporter at the New Florence County Judicial Center, on July 5, 2018, in Florence, South Carolina, at approximately 9:05 *am* (See Exhibits B and C).
4. The first time the transcript was mailed to Appellant by Court Reporter was on December 4, 2017, and was returned to the Court Reporter by the US Postal Service on March 7, 2018 (See Exhibit D).
5. Appellant submits that from the date that the transcript was first mailed to him, and the date the US Postal Service returned the transcript to Court Reporter was approximately ninety three (93) days (See Exhibit D, date of mailing and return sticker on package).
6. In an email mailed to Appellant from Court Reporter dated May 21, 2018, states in part that she (Court Reporter) tracked the transcript to the US Postal Service Virginia Distribution Center, where the transcript was for almost two (2) months (See Exhibit E, paragraph 1).
7. Appellant believes that the Court Reporter had an obligation to notify the South Carolina Court Administration, the South Carolina Court of Appeals and all other parties that the transcript was being held up by the US Postal Service as soon as she knew (See Exhibit E, paragraph 1).

8. Appellant submits that if the Court Reporter had notified all parties that it was the US Postal Service holding up delivery of the transcript, the Appeals Court would have no reason to dismiss this case prematurely.
9. On a letter dated March 8, 2018, mailed to Appellant from the South Carolina Court of Appeals requesting an alternative mailing address for the transcript. Appellant mailed an alternative mailing address on March 14, 2018 (*See Exhibits F and G*).
10. On a letter dated January 22, 2018, written to Court Reporter by Appellant stated that he had not received the copy of the transcript (*See Exhibit H*).
11. In another letter dated February 8, 2018, written to Court Reporter by Appellant, in reference to the transcript (*See Exhibit I*).
12. In a letter dated February 14, 2018, written to Court Report by Appellant, again in regards to the transcript. (*See Exhibit J*).
13. On a letter dated May 28, 2018, another update written by Appellant to the South Carolina Court Administration regarding the transcript (*See Exhibit K*).
14. Appellant submits the two (2) US Postal service documents from the Sumter Postal Service Tracking Reports stating that the transcript was returned to sender on December 20, 2017 (*See Exhibits L and M*).

## SUMTER POSTAL SERVICE TRACKING REPORTS

15. Two (2) US Postal Service Tracking Reports indicates that delivery attempt were made on December 5, 2017, and the transcript was returned to the Court Reporter on December 20, 2017. Appellant submit that this is the transcript mailing from the Court Reporter that were held up for ninety three (93) days at some Postal Service Facility in Virginia or elsewhere for which *Exhibit D* clearly shows.
16. Appellant Submit that no notice of the attempted delivery of the transcript were ever left at 901 Manning Avenue by the US Postal Service (*See Affidavit of Charlie L. Jones*). The 901 Manning Avenue address has a mail slot drop box, and all mail drops inside the property, and no other person than the Appellant has access to the property.

## SECOND MAILING OF THE TRANSCRIPT

17. On March 22, 2018, the Court Reporter mailed the transcript to the alternative address requested by the South Carolina Court of Appeals. The transcript was mailed to:  
  
Charlie L. Jones, P. O. Box 2996, Sumter, SC 29151, and the transcript were returned by the US Postal Service to Court Reporter on May 21, 2018 (*See Exhibit N*).
18. The US Postal Service claims that a delivery attempt was made on April 9, 2018. The zip code indicates that an attempt was made to 901 Manning Avenue, Sumter, SC 29150 again (*See Exhibit O, page 6*).

19. The US Postal Service would have had to put a notice in P. O. Box 2996, Sumter, SC 29151, in order to claim a delivery attempt. No such notice was ever placed in P. O. Box 2996, Sumter, SC 29151 (*See Affidavit of Charlie L. Jones*). The transcript was the most essential part of the evidence needed for Appellant's Appeal.

**APPELLANT GIVEN TEN (10) DAYS TO FILE INITIAL BRIEF AND DESIGNATION OF  
MATTER WITHOUT THE TRANSCRIPT**

20. On a letter dated May 11, 2018, the South Carolina Court of Appeals gave the Appellant ten (10) days to file his Initial Brief and Designation of Matter, or Appellant's case would be dismissed. The letter came shortly after the South Carolina Supreme Court denied Appellant's Motion to Turnover Transcript (*See Exhibits O and P*).

**FILING INITIAL BRIEF AND RECORD ON APPEAL WITHOUT THE TRANSCRIPT**

21. The analogy of filing an Initial Brief and Record on Appeal without the transcript is like giving a soldier a weapon, but no ammunition.

22. Time for filing an Initial Brief; **RULE 208 INITIAL BRIEF** states: "**(1) Brief of Appellant.** Within thirty (30) days after receiving the transcript or, if no transcript is ordered, within thirty (30) days after serving the notice of appeal, appellant shall served one copy of his brief on all parties, and file with the clerk of the appellate court one copy of the brief with proof of service" (*See Exhibit Q, Appellate Rule 208*). The Appellant did not have the transcript in order to properly file a brief, or comply according to Appellate Rules.

23. **RULE 208 INITIAL BRIEF (4) states in part: (4) References to Record.** The brief shall contain references to the transcript, pleadings, orders, exhibits, or other materials which may be properly included in the Record on Appeal {see Rule 210 (c)} to support the salient facts alleged” (*See Exhibit R, Appellate Rule 208*). Without the transcript, no references to the information in the transcript could have been submitted in Appellant’s Initial Brief or Record on Appeal.

24. **RULE 209 DESIGNATION OF MATTER TO BE INCLUDED IN THE RECORD ON APPEAL,** states in part that of what is to be included in the Record on Appeal. The Appellant believe the transcript would have the most important parts of the evidence for the Designation of Matter to be included in the Record on Appeal (*See Exhibit S, Appellate Rule 209*).

25. The Appellant worked diligently from January 2018 to July 5, 2018, even after the case had been dismissed by the South Carolina Court of Appeals trying to get a copy of the transcript, including asking the Sumter Branch of the NAACP to get involved. It was only after the NAACP got involved that an appointment to pick up the transcript were finally kept by the Court Reporter (*See Exhibits B and C, T & U*).

26. On or about May 23, 2018, the Court Reporter finally decided not to mail the transcript again, but meet with me at some point and deliver the transcript in person (*See Exhibit V*).

27. The following exhibits will show several other examples of how Appellant kept making continuous efforts in notifying the parties, and trying to get the transcript from the Court

Reporter (See Exhibits W, X, Y and Z).

28. Appellant submits that all situations confronted by courts, cannot be put into Rules and Statues. This is one reason why courts have the power to correct errors and vacate unfair rulings, when it is in the interest of justice.

### REQUEST FROM THE COURT

Based on the information contained in this MOTION TO REINSTATE APPEAL, Appellant request of the South Carolina Court of Appeals, to Reinstate this case as though it were never dismissed, and allow the Appellant thirty (30) days, from the date of a favorable ruling to submit his Initial Brief and Record on Appeal.


informing me that a package was available for pickup at the Sumter Postal Service.

Dear Mr. Jones:

I received your letter of February 5, 2018 indicating that the post office in Sumter informed you that through their Product Tracking & Reporting system that there were "no results for the search criteria", and that your transcript would have been returned to me. While I understand your frustration, I have no reason to want to take your money and keep the transcript and don't appreciate your insinuating such. I have online verification that your transcript is still at the post office; and if you need me to produce it, I can do so. I tracked it online January 16 and February 7; and on both occasions, it indicated your transcript is at the Sumter Post Office and they're awaiting for you to "schedule redelivery of your item."

In order to help get this resolved, I made a trip to the Florence Post Office today to inquire about your transcript. I showed them the tracking number. Whoever did the search for you at the Sumter Post Office did a "quick search," and the reason it showed no results was because it had been more than 45 days from the date of attempted delivery. They obviously didn't work too diligently or he/she would have found it. The postal employee I spoke with in Florence called and spoke directly with the Sumter Post Office supervisor and was informed that your transcript is still there waiting for you to pick it up. In the future I would suggest when receiving certified mail that you claim it, and not ignore it, thereby, avoiding this problem all together.

**RE: LETTER DATED FEBRUARY 8, 2018:**

Dear Ms. Ray,

I received your latest correspondence on February 13<sup>th</sup>, and went immediately to the Sumter County Postal Service to pick up the package you claimed you were told by the Florence Postal Service was waiting for me to pick up. This time I had an actual *POSTMASTER, Mr. James A. Harrell*, he look for the package for about thirty minutes, out front and in the rear of facility, and afterward did a search on their computers. The results were that the package was returned to SENDER on December 20, 2017 (see attached). I cannot argue or debate with US Postal Service Employees, when they have supplied me with the records that they have.

I can see that you are getting frustrated regarding this matter. However, this tracking process has to begin and end with you and the US Postal Service. I am following the lawful process of trying to track this package. Therefore, I will not allow you to blame me for any incompetents of Postal Employees, or anyone else that may have came in contact with these transcripts, nor will I be distracted from what I must do regarding this case. Is it possible that the transcripts may have been misplaced upon being returned from the US Postal Service?

Additionally, I have been submitting proof to all parties, of what are being said to me by the US Postal Service, you and myself. I have not seen any proof to back up what you have been saying, other than the tracking numbers of the package that the *US Postal Service, d b a Postmaster Mr. James A. Harrell*, said were returned to SENDER on *December 20, 2017* (see attachment).

Regarding delivery of certified mail, one has to be in the city to sign for the package. I am requesting that you research any and all packages that you sent out by Certified Mail, and see if any packages were returned, and see if the transcripts are among them, if so, please let me

know.

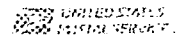

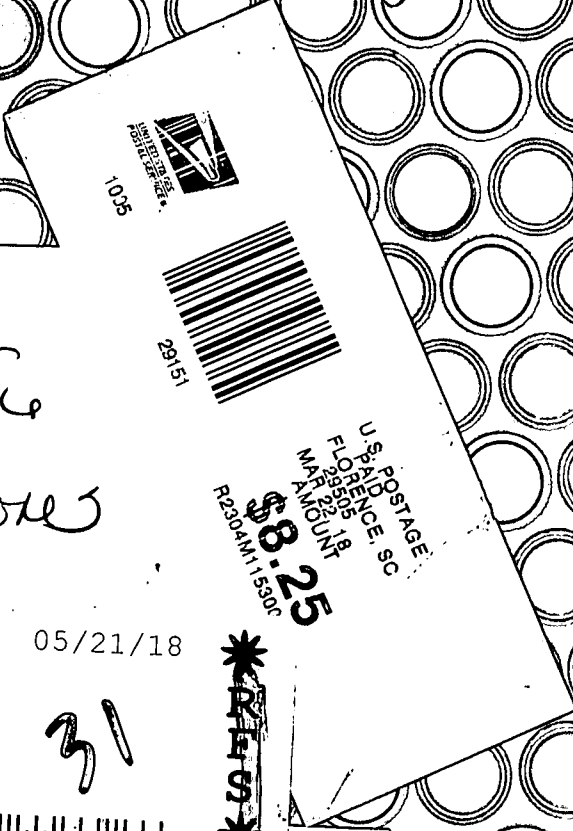
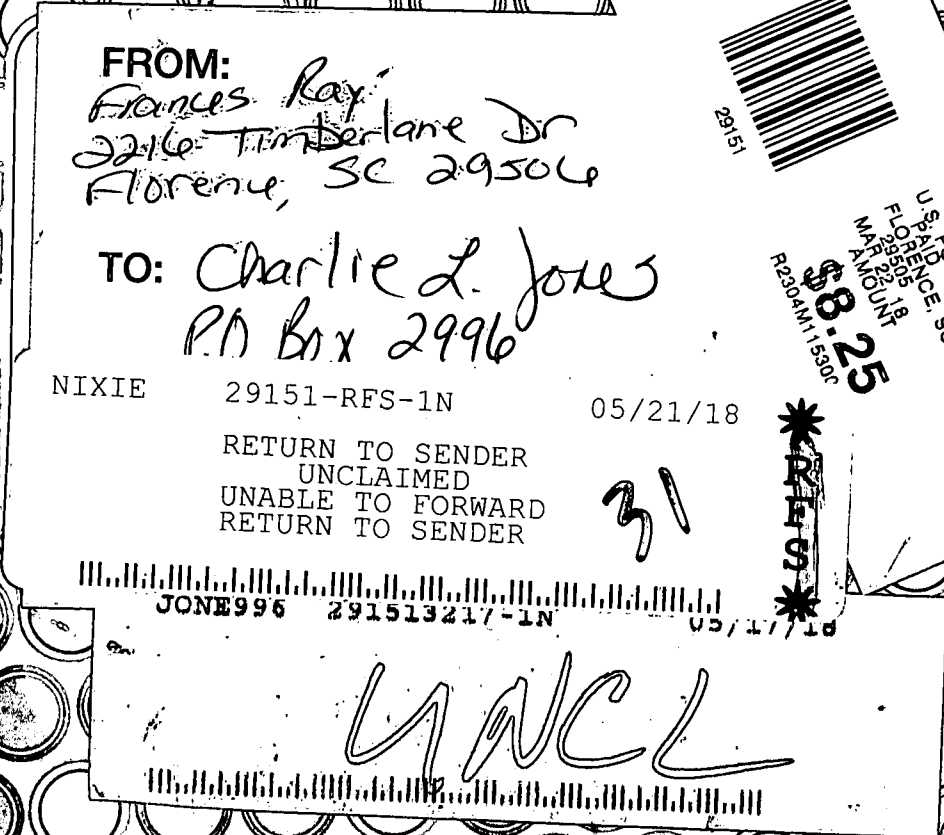

### ORDER

This appeal in this case is pending before the South Carolina Court of Appeals.<sup>1</sup> Appellant has now filed a motion with this Court seeking to compel the court reporter, Frances B. Ray, to turn over the transcript, and to have her held in contempt under Rule 207 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR). He bases this motion on his failure to receive the transcript that the court reporter indicates she mailed to him on December 4, 2017.

The United States Postal Service Tracking Number for this first mailing is 70170530000102996770.<sup>2</sup> The tracking information for this number (enclosed) shows that the initial mailing arrived at the delivery address in Sumter on December 5, 2017. Since "no authorized recipient [was] available," a notice was left.

Further, the records of the Court of Appeals reflect that, after the first mailing, the Court of Appeals asked appellant to provide his address, and he provided the address of Charles L. Jones, P.O. Box 2996, Sumter, SC 29151. On March 22,



2018, the Court Reporter mailed a copy of the transcript to the address provided by appellant. See enclosed Certified Mail Receipt with Tracking Number 70153010000162661841. The United States Postal Service tracking information for this number (enclosed) indicates that this mailing arrived at the delivery address in Sumter on April 9, 2018, and a notice was left due to "no authorized recipient [being] available."

Since it appears that the court reporter has in fact caused a copy of the transcript to arrive at appellant's address on two occasions, she has delivered the transcript for the purpose of Rule 207, SCACR. Further, if appellant has not actually received either copy, it appears that this is due to his failure to respond to the notices left by the United States Postal Service.

**RULE 209**

**DESIGNATION OF MATTER TO BE INCLUDED IN THE RECORD ON APPEAL**

**(a) Time to Serve and File.** At the same time a party serves his initial brief(s) under Rule 208, to include a reply brief, he shall also serve on all parties to the appeal a Designation of Matter to be Included in the Record on Appeal which shall set forth with specificity those parts of the transcript, pleadings, orders, exhibits, or other materials which he proposes to include in the record on appeal. One copy of this Designation with proof of service shall immediately be filed with the clerk of the appellate court.

**(b) Content.** The Designation must clearly identify what the party desires to have included in the Record on Appeal, and the Designation may only propose to include portions of the transcript, pleadings, orders, exhibits, or other materials which may be properly included in the Record on Appeal [See Rule 210(c) ]. A party shall not include any matter in his Designation which is not relevant to the appeal.

**(c) Certification.** The Designation shall be accompanied by a certificate signed by the party's counsel of record that the Designation contains no matter which is irrelevant to the appeal.




