Reason for Appeal on original Guilty Plea.

1. Was extradited from Stephens County, GA without EVER having an extradition hearing or waiving my rights to one.
2. Illegal sentence and charge. Was told on record that no weapon was found or used. Therefore that is a deterring factor for DVHAN. Also no Great Bodily Injury was sustained. A 3cm laceration doesn't constitute GBI as no anesthesia was used and it was not a deadly injury and was a one time medical visit.
3. The Honorable R. Scott Spruess said on two occasions that he was not going to be able to hear or accept any plea on my behalf.
4. Counselor Jennings Byford never explained that a plea to DVHAN was a non parolable offense.
5. Faxed a request to Attorney within the 10 day limit asking her to withdraw plea. Faxed by a corrections


officer in Oconee County Jail. His first name was
Chris. MS Byford never filed to withdraw plea.


6. With no weapon nor any Great Bodily Injury
present Defense attorney should not of allowed
any plea for DVHAN be made. Defense attorney
questions herself on transcript after State reveals no

be able to move forward."

Defense attorney Byford obviously didn't know what
factors needed to be present for DVHAN and at
most a charge of DV1 or DV2 should of been
the charge. So Ms Byford is an ineffective assistance
of Counsel.

be granted an appeal and relief on the
charge of DVHAN.



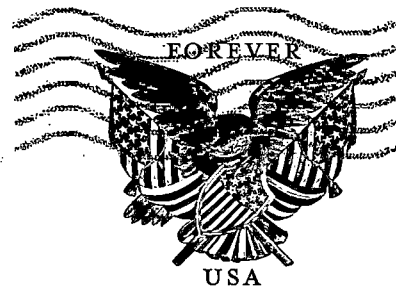
