



ORDER

Counsel for petitioner moves to be allowed to file a petition for a writ of certiorari that exceeds the twenty-five page limit set forth in Rule 242(d)(4), SCACR. Counsel states opposing counsel consents to the motion. The motion is denied. Counsel shall, within ten days of the date of this order, serve and file an amended petition for a writ of certiorari that is within the page limit. In amending the petition, counsel may wish to consider condensing or eliminating the sixteen-page Statement of Facts section, which is not contemplated by Rule 242(d), and including all relevant facts within the arguments presented as to each issue, as Rule 242(d)(4) directs.
