


## ORDER

Richard Mavins has filed a suppression motion pursuant to the South Carolina Homeland Security Act (the Act).<sup>1</sup> The motion is denied. *See State v. Stuckey*, 333 S.C. 56, 58, 508 S.E.2d 564, 564 (1998) ("Since there is no right to 'hybrid representation' that is partially *pro se* and partially by counsel, substantive documents, with the exception of motions to relieve counsel, filed *pro se* by a person represented by counsel are not to be accepted unless submitted by counsel.").
