APPELLANT'S OBJECT TO RESPONDENT'S RETURN
TO APPELLANT PETITION FOR REHEARING

The Appellant received Respondent's Return to the Appellant Petition for Rehearing August 20, 2018, and submits the following objections:

I.

Appellant must be allowed to enter proof of irregularities in the agency exercising procedures in a arbitrary capriciously manner; and instrument having no legal existence; intentional misrepresentation/deceptive behavior show in the record. The Appellant submits that any person may petition an agency in writing for a declaratory ruling as to the applicability of regulation(s), pursuant to SC Code Ann § 16-5-60 (1985). II.



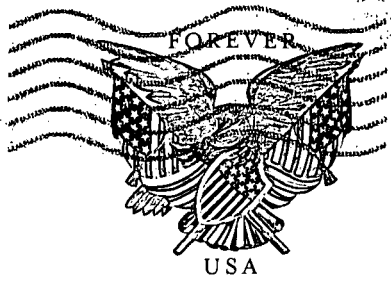

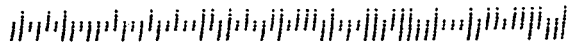
