RESPONSE TO THE COURT'S AUGUST 8th ORDER

TO THE HONORABLE APPEALS COURT

1) Appellant received the Appeal Courts August 8th ORDER on August 10th in response to Appellant's July 20, 2018, date stamped "July 26"; back from the Court of Appeals, received on July 31st, inside Appellant's self-addressed envelope that was not Postal Federal metered, a pattern history of such, and another strange occurrence with this Appellant/Plaintiff.

2) Upon receiving this Courts order Appellant immediately managed to make a copy of said August 8 order and hand deliver it, along with a short letter to the same person who paid the \$100.⁰⁰ appeal filing fee.

To date, Friday August 24th, Appellant has not received a response from this supporter. . . .

3) Based on the past history, especially recently within the past 2-3 months, Appellant and company have grave concern that, per the honorable Judge James twenty (20) day order to provide proof the motion hearing transcript was ordered, that a high probability exist, the receiver may have not timely or received Appellant's request for assistance.

4) In fact the receiver or financial source has previously expressed, in hand writing concern and dislike to Appellant that she does not receive Appellant's letters or documentation and when Appellant's letters are received they are not received until "8 or 9 days from the date Appellant "mailed them".

5) Defendant SCDC refuses to photocopy this supporting letter, allegedly because it is "handwritten". Thus, Appellant is not permitted to timely provide this truth to the Court presently; however Appellant's file is open for review upon an injunction to order relevant photocopies to fairly and fully hear this case on the merits.

6) of further significance, on August 16. sworn oral depositions began in the Second Assault and Battery by Mob also at Ridgel and Institution that Plaintiff is represented by the Bell Law Firm in state case No.

- 7) This partial deposition lasted 5 1/2 hours, and is ongoing or tolled until Senior Counsel for Plaintiff, Mrs. Victoria "Knight" is able to photocopy and redact certain portions of documents and Plaintiff's Factual Journal in that case for discovery purposes.
- 8) During this deposition, it was first revealed that Ms. Knight claimed the Bell Firm "did not receive several important-relevant documents that Appellant hand delivered to MacDougall staff for mailing. Because according to attorney Ms. Knight, "our firm scans all incoming mail!"
- 9) Appellant has duplicates of all referenced legal documents that were previously mailed to the Bell Law Firm, specifying each attorney he mailed the items to. These essential copies are readily available to the Court for verification to further support the fact that this Appellants outgoing and incoming mail are not being delivered.
- 10) Appellant is not the only person at MacDougall that experienced lost or disappeared legal and regular mail, including the newly appointed IRC Chairman Antonio Patterson and Ricky New, SCDC # 247874
- 11) A detailed history can be provided and is encouraged to be recommended by the Justice Court for an appropriate independent investigation.
- 12) Prior to June of 2018, and specifically in June of 2018 defendant SCDC contracted defense attorneys, SCDC General Counsel staff and other SCDC employees in collusion ~~and~~ orchestrated multiple personal attacks upon Appellant's person and his very little remaining personal property items

13) on the third search within twenty-two (22) hours to Appellants cube, a plot was hatched to Institutionally charge for 903, see Attachment A for an overly broad disciplinary charge for alleged expired proscribed-to Appellants (Zantac-generic) medication, that resulted in a 5 day mental health - Medical crisis, . . . that was ultimately dismissed by the proper authority before the disciplinary hearing. Praise the Lord!

14) Additionally, within the past 2 months large quantities of drugs and other serious contraband have been confiscated or intercepted during smuggling and throw over attempts.

Appellant further sayest not.
