


ORDER

Petitioner filed a notice of appeal from the denial of his fourth application for post-conviction relief (PCR). Petitioner was asked to provide the explanation required by Rule 243(c), SCACR, and in light of the number of PCR applications petitioner has filed, he was also asked to provide any reasons this Court should not impose restrictions on his filing of collateral actions or motions in the circuit court challenging his 1996 conviction and sentence for assault and battery with intent to kill (1995-GS-23-7051).

Petitioner has failed to show that there is an arguable basis for asserting the dismissal of his fourth PCR application was improper, nor has he asserted any reason this Court should not impose restrictions on his future filings. Accordingly, we dismiss the notice of appeal pursuant to Rule 243(c), SCACR. In addition, we hereby prohibit petitioner from filing any further collateral actions in the circuit court, including PCR actions and habeas corpus actions, as well as any motions relating to the previously filed collateral actions, challenging his 1996 conviction and sentence for assault and battery with intent to kill, or any motions in the underlying criminal case, including a motion pursuant to Rule 29, SCRCrimP, without first obtaining permission to do so from this Court.
