1 THE COURT: Well, I mean, go in and see if the jury
2 would want to eat and continue deliberating and order
3 supper, or would they -- hear the testimony that they want
4 and we'll order supper for them, or go home and come back
5 in the morning and start over new?

6 THE BAILIFF: We can pose that question, Your Honor.

7 THE COURT: You can?

8 THE CLERK: Yes.

9 THE COURT: Well, that's what I want to do. At
10 least, that's what I propose. If you have an objection,
11 then, of course, we won't do that.

12 MR. GREGORY: No objection from the State.

13 THE COURT: Mr. Robinson?

14 MR. ROBINSON: No objection, Judge.

15 THE COURT: Just do that. And tell them just as we
16 discussed, if we did order supper -- in other words, are
17 they close enough to get a verdict -- just would they want
18 to do it, or do they want to go ahead and hear the
19 testimony, and all that.

20 THE BAILIFF: Yes, sir.

21 THE COURT: Or play the recordings.

22 THE BAILIFF: They did mention when they handed me
23 that note they wanted to watch them or listen to them back
24 to back, while they were in here, do them all.

25 THE COURT: There's no problem with that, is there?

1 MR. GREGORY: No, Your Honor.

2 THE COURT: That's perfect.

3 Thank you so much.

4 Pose that to them.

5 (WHEREUPON, a brief break was taken.)

6 THE COURT: Yes, sir.

7 THE BAILIFF: Your Honor, they would like to continue
8 and possibly try to finish tonight.

9 THE COURT: All right. Do they want us to order
10 supper?

11 THE BAILIFF: They feel like they're making progress.
12 They'd prefer to watch the videos while their dinner is
13 being ordered and come back and get to work.

14 THE COURT: Very good.

15 Anything from the State?

16 MR. GREGORY: No, Your Honor.

17 THE COURT: From the Defense?

18 MR. ROBINSON: No, sir, Judge.

19 THE COURT: All right. Ask them to come back.

20 (WHEREUPON, the jury came into open court at
21 approximately 5:51 p.m.)

22 THE COURT: All right. Mr. Foreman, ladies and
23 gentlemen of the jury, I do find the question the jury
24 would like to hear the recordings of Mitchell Sloan and
25 Tiara Washington; is that correct?

1 JUROR #136, JONATHAN REIMER: Yes. That is correct.

2 THE COURT: And I understand you want to hear them at
3 the same time -- or back to back?

4 JUROR #136, JONATHAN REIMER: Yes, sir, back to back.

5 THE COURT: All right. Solicitor, are you in charge
6 of the --

7 MR. GREGORY: Yes, Your Honor.

8 THE COURT: -- technology? I think Mitchell Sloan
9 was the first one.

10 MR. GREGORY: That's what I put in, Your Honor.

11 THE COURT: All right.

12 (WHEREUPON, State's Exhibit No. 53 was played in
13 open court.)

14 THE COURT: You may proceed.

15 (WHEREUPON, State's Exhibit No. 54 was played in
16 open court.)

17 THE COURT: All right. Is that the two recordings?

18 MR. GREGORY: Yes, Your Honor.

19 THE COURT: Is there anything else, Mr. Foreman?

20 JUROR #136, JONATHAN REIMER: I believe that was it.

21 THE COURT: All right. Very good.

22 Please return to your jury room and continue
23 deliberations.

24 (WHEREUPON, the jury was excused from open court at
25 approximately 6:24 p.m.)

1 THE COURT: All right. Is there anything further
2 from the State before we --

3 MR. GREGORY: No, Your Honor.

4 THE COURT: From the Defense?

5 MR. ROBINSON: No, sir, Judge.

6 THE COURT: Very good.

7 We'll just wait on the verdict.

8 (WHEREUPON, the proceedings were recessed at
9 approximately 6:25 p.m.)

10 THE COURT: All right. We're back on the record in
11 the case of State v. Williams.

12 The jury has sent out another question, "What was
13 Tiara's telephone number?"

14 If you'd like to view it.

15 MR. GREGORY: I don't think it was ever in the
16 record, Your Honor. And they have what they have back
17 there.

18 THE COURT: Was it -- I mean, in the testimony, I'm
19 not talking about the evidence.

20 MR. ROBINSON: It never came up, Judge, as far as her
21 number goes. It never was put into the record.

22 THE COURT: Is that correct?

23 MR. ROBINSON: Wait a second. Wait a second. I
24 think when Officer Fortner talked to her, originally, I
25 think that he asked her for her address and phone number.

1 So I think if we have it on the --

2 THE COURT: Just a minute.

3 MR. ROBINSON: -- tape.

4 MR. GREGORY: Is that the one you said had a lot of
5 fours?

6 THE CLERK: When she said 444 --

7 THE COURT: Yeah, all the fours.

8 MR. ROBINSON: Yes, sir.

9 THE COURT: All right. That's right at the first, is
10 it not?

11 MR. GREGORY: Yes, Your Honor.

12 (WHEREUPON, Court's Exhibit No. 5 was marked for
13 identification and admitted into evidence.)

14 (Pause.)

15 THE COURT: I've got 864-444 --

16 MR. GREGORY: 9495.

17 THE COURT: All right. Who has the best handwriting?

18 THE CLERK: I'll do it.

19 THE COURT: Do it on a Post-it. And if it's good
20 enough, I'm going to just attach it.

21 (Pause.)

22 THE COURT: All right. What I'm doing is using a
23 Post-it to attach it to the -- well, let's do this --

24 THE CLERK: Do you want me to make a copy?

25 THE COURT: Make a copy of the exhibit. And then

1 take the copy and write the number down.

2 THE CLERK: Write it on this?

3 THE COURT: Yes. Just write it down and we'll make a
4 copy for us and send it back.

5 THE CLERK: 9495; right?

6 THE COURT: 864-444-9495.

7 THE CLERK: Does that suit you?

8 THE COURT: It looks fine.

9 All right. Is that what you have, Mr. Gregory?

10 MR. GREGORY: That's what we have, yes, sir.

11 THE COURT: All right. Mr. Robinson.

12 THE CLERK: Do you want show it to them?

13 THE COURT: Yes. Just show it to them.

14 Now, make a copy of that and we'll send the other.

15 And ask if they have any further questions. If so, then
16 we'll bring them out.

17 (Pause.)

18 THE COURT: All right. Let's see what the return is.

19 (WHEREUPON, a brief break was taken.)

20 THE COURT: Mr. Bailiff.

21 THE BAILIFF: They didn't have any additional
22 questions. That satisfied their --

23 THE COURT: Very good.

24 Anything else from the State?

25 MR. GREGORY: Nothing from the State.

1 THE COURT: The Defense?

2 MR. ROBINSON: No, Your Honor.

3 THE COURT: All right. Very good.

4 (WHEREUPON, the proceedings were recessed at
5 approximately 8:02 p.m.)

6 THE COURT: Ladies and gentlemen, it's now 9:00. The
7 jury has been out, at least, two hours since supper. And
8 I think they went out about 4:00, was it not? I didn't
9 write it down.

10 THE CLERK: 4:30.

11 THE COURT: 4:30. So we're talking about four and a
12 half hours. Well, first off, I'll ask if counsel has any
13 suggestions as to what to do, if anything?

14 MR. GREGORY: The only suggestion we have is to ask
15 the jury if they want to keep going, or if they want to
16 break for the night and return in the morning.

17 THE COURT: Mr. Robinson?

18 MR. ROBINSON: I think they should break for the
19 night.

20 THE COURT: Well, I'm glad that both counsel are in
21 agreement. Because -- I know you don't need any history.
22 But I think some of us remember how it used to be in the
23 old days that judges would punish the juries until they,
24 finally, came to a verdict. And so they were out until
25 3:00 or 4:00 in the morning.

1 And back in those days, I was practicing law and on
2 two such occasions, the verdict that was obtained I didn't
3 agree with. And both cases were reversed. In other
4 words, I just think that a fresh jury looking at the case
5 is better than one that just feels coerced to return a
6 verdict. Not that that ever happens, but it's possible.

7 All right. With that now, Mr. Bailiff, do you
8 understand?

9 THE BAILIFF: Yes, sir.

10 THE COURT: Just ask them if they would like to keep
11 deliberating, or break for the evening and come back in
12 the morning.

13 THE BAILIFF: Yes, sir.

14 THE COURT: Very good.

15 (WHEREUPON, a brief break was taken.)

16 THE BAILIFF: Your Honor --

17 THE COURT: Yes, sir.

18 THE BAILIFF: -- they're requesting 10 more minutes
19 to clarify one point they're working on. And they said
20 they doubt that they would have a verdict at the end of
21 the 10 minutes. And, if not, they would come back in the
22 morning.

23 THE COURT: All right. Very good.

24 Again, I want to be sure that everybody understands
25 that it's not that I want to interfere with their

1 deliberations. But I, certainly, want whatever verdict
2 they reach is a comfortable one.

3 So I think that's -- they've got a good attitude.

4 All right. We'll wait until the call of the jury.

5 (WHEREUPON, the proceedings were recessed at
6 approximately 9:09 p.m.)

7 THE COURT: Mr. Bailiff.

8 THE BAILIFF: Your Honor, they have finished the one
9 point that they were trying to work on and agree with.
10 Their 10 minutes is up. They're ready to go home!

11 THE COURT: All right. Bring them out, please.

12 Let me just ask, is there anything from the State
13 before we bring the jury out?

14 MR. GREGORY: No, Your Honor.

15 MR. ROBINSON: No, sir.

16 THE COURT: And I'll do what we discussed earlier,
17 letting them retire for the evening and come back in the
18 morning. I'm, also, going to let them choose the time --

19 MR. GREGORY: That's fine, Your Honor.

20 THE COURT: -- as they would like.

21 From the Defendant?

22 MR. ROBINSON: That's fine with me, Your Honor.

23 THE COURT: Very good. Ask the jury to join us.

24 (WHEREUPON, the jury came into open court at
25 approximately 9:24 p.m.)

1 THE COURT: All right. Mr. Foreman, ladies and
2 gentlemen of the jury, I understand that you have not
3 reached a verdict; is that correct, Mr. Foreman?

4 JUROR #136, JONATHAN REIMER: Yes. That is correct,
5 sir.

6 THE COURT: And that it is now 9:20 something, 9:24.
7 I would suggest that you do retire for the evening and
8 come back in the morning, hopefully, a little refreshed.
9 Because y'all have been very diligent today, in fact,
10 every day we've had this case, I think, since Tuesday. So
11 this is the third day -- really, going into the third day.

12 I would -- I'm going to leave it up to you,
13 Mr. Foreman, like I did the first day on the lunch break,
14 as to what time you would like to start in the morning.
15 Just consult with your jury. And, as I say, this is not a
16 unanimous decision. It's a consensus as to what time
17 you'd like to start.

18 JUROR #136, JONATHAN REIMER: We would wish to begin
19 at 9:30, Your Honor.

20 THE COURT: 9:30 in the morning?

21 JUROR #136, JONATHAN REIMER: Yes, sir.

22 THE COURT: Very well.

23 I'm going to see you at 9:30 then. No, that's fine.
24 Y'all are the ones that really -- and I want to commend
25 you, at this point, that you have been very conscientious

1 and, as I said earlier, diligent. And I appreciate it.

2 So with that, I will see you again.

3 Now, do understand, you have undertaken discussion of
4 the case, but only you know what is at issue here. So do
5 not permit anyone to discuss it with you or in any way, as
6 I say, do any research, or anything like that on your own.
7 But if somebody should attempt -- I'm serious, explain it
8 to them that this, obviously, is a very serious case to
9 everyone involved. And it needs to be resolved in proper
10 fashion.

11 With that, I'll excuse you and see you tomorrow
12 morning at 9:30.

13 Everyone remain seated while the jury retires from
14 the courtroom.

15 If any of the ladies need escorts to their cars,
16 please provide that.

17 THE COURTROOM OFFICER: Yes, sir.

18 (WHEREUPON, the jury was excused from open court at
19 approximately 9:27 p.m.)

20 THE COURT: I will see everyone at 9:30 in the
21 morning.

22 (WHEREUPON, the proceedings were concluded at
23 approximately 9:27 p.m., to be reconvened on
24 Friday, August 11, 2017.)
25

1 FRIDAY, AUGUST 11, 2017

2 THE COURT: All right. Is there anything before we
3 bring the jury in?

4 I'm going to bring them in and see if they have any
5 questions, and then send them back to continue their
6 deliberations.

7 Anything from the State?

8 MR. GREGORY: No, Your Honor.

9 THE COURT: From the Defense?

10 THE COURTROOM OFFICER: Your Honor, the Defendant is
11 not here. There was an issue at the jail earlier this
12 morning. He should be here in the next 10 minutes.

13 THE COURT: Oh, gracious. I'm sorry. I didn't even
14 think about that. Very good.

15 We'll wait until the Defendant is here.

16 We'll stand at ease until the Defendant gets here.

17 (WHEREUPON, a break was taken.)

18 THE COURT: Are we ready to proceed from the State?

19 MR. GREGORY: Yes, Your Honor.

20 THE COURT: From the Defense?

21 MR. ROBINSON: Yes, Judge.

22 THE COURT: All right. Ask the jury to join us, if
23 they would, please.

24 (WHEREUPON, the jury came into open court at
25 approximately 9:55 a.m.)

1 THE COURT: Mr. Foreman -- or let the record reflect
2 the jury is in the jury box.

3 Mr. Foreman, just for the record, I wanted to see if
4 there are any questions or anything you have before or
5 during your deliberations.

6 Is there anything that the Court can help you with as
7 far as your deliberations?

8 JUROR #136, JONATHAN REIMER: No, sir, Your Honor,
9 not at this time.

10 THE COURT: All right. Very well. With that, I am
11 going to ask you now to go back and continue the
12 deliberations. And when you've reached a verdict, if you
13 would, please, knock on the door and we'll ask you to come
14 back.

15 JUROR #136, JONATHAN REIMER: Yeah. We would like to
16 see the evidence.

17 THE COURT: We're going to send all the exhibits
18 back.

19 JUROR #136, JONATHAN REIMER: Thank you.

20 THE COURT: Very good.

21 Thank you.

22 (WHEREUPON, the jury was excused from open court at
23 approximately 9:56 a.m.)

24 THE COURT: By agreement of counsel, I made a copy of
25 the note about the phone number. And on the copy, I wrote

1 the number that the record reflects, so that's included in
2 the exhibits. It's a Court's Exhibit as far as the
3 question is concerned. But it's now -- since it was sent
4 back to the jury by agreement, it will stay within their
5 purview.

6 All right. Is there anything further from the State?

7 MR. GREGORY: No, Your Honor.

8 THE COURT: From the Defense?

9 MR. ROBINSON: No, sir.

10 THE COURT: All right. We'll stand at ease awaiting
11 a verdict from the jury.

12 (WHEREUPON, the proceedings were recessed at
13 approximately 9:57 a.m.)

14 THE COURT: I understand the jury has reached a
15 verdict.

16 Is there anything from the State before we bring the
17 jury back?

18 MR. GREGORY: No, Your Honor.

19 THE COURT: Anything from the Defendant?

20 MR. ROBINSON: No, Judge.

21 THE COURT: Very good. Ask the jury to join us.

22 (WHEREUPON, the jury came into open court at
23 approximately 10:38 a.m.)

24 THE COURT: Mr. Foreman, have you reached a verdict?

25 JUROR #136, JONATHAN REIMER: Yes, Your Honor, we

1 have.

2 THE COURT: On both indictments?

3 JUROR #136, JONATHAN REIMER: Yes.

4 THE COURT: If you would hand it up to the bailiff,
5 please.

6 Thank you.

7 Madam Clerk, if you would, please, publish the
8 indictments.

9 VERDICT

10 THE CLERK: Your Honor, this is indictment number
11 2015-GS-23-2941, the State of South Carolina v. Bradford
12 Hester Williams, count one, we, the jury, unanimously find
13 the Defendant, Bradford Hester Williams, guilty of the
14 murder of Jamal Justice. Count two, guilty of possession
15 of a weapon during the commission of a violent crime,
16 August 11th, 2017, signed Jonathan T. Reimer, Foreman.

17 Also, indictment number 2015-GS-23-2942, the State of
18 South Carolina v. Bradford Hester Williams. We, the jury,
19 unanimously find the Defendant, Bradford Hester Williams,
20 guilty of the murder of Sylvester Fuller. Count two,
21 guilty of possession of a weapon during the commission of
22 a violent crime, signed August 11th, 2017, Jonathan T.
23 Reimer, Foreman.

24 If this is your verdict, so say you all. Please
25 signify by raising your right hand.

1 (WHEREUPON, all of the jurors raised their right
2 hand.)

3 THE CLERK: Thank you.

4 THE COURT: And is it still your verdict?

5 JUROR #136, JONATHAN REIMER: Yes, Your Honor.

6 THE COURT: Indicate by the same sign, raising your
7 right hand.

8 (WHEREUPON, all of the jurors raised their right
9 hand.)

10 THE COURT: Anything from the State?

11 MR. GREGORY: Not from the State, Your Honor.

12 THE COURT: Anything from the Defendant?

13 MR. ROBINSON: No, sir, Judge.

14 THE COURT: Mr. Foreman, and, ladies and gentlemen of
15 the jury, the Court is never interested in the verdict of
16 the jury, only how that verdict is reached. And I can say
17 in this particular case, I was impressed not only with
18 your diligence, but, also, your attention to the
19 testimony, the evidence, as well as some of the
20 discussions between the Court and the attorneys.

21 Also, obviously, the time that you spent on it in
22 the -- not only the time, but the period that you spent on
23 it -- I think we were here until 9:30 last night and back
24 at 9:30 this morning. So I am perfectly and completely
25 satisfied that you did give both sides, the State and the

1 Defendant, a fair and impartial trial.

2 And I thank you for your service.

3 Now, I know none of you asked to be here. In other
4 words, you are the only ones in this courtroom, really,
5 who are here by subpoena. The rest of us are here by
6 either profession or some other condition that brings us
7 to court. But that is the ingenious, if you would, of our
8 system of justice, citizen participation.

9 The fact that you have taken off from your lives,
10 your work, your private lives as well to perform a service
11 that is essential to our system of justice, as I say -- in
12 fact, what is it? Y'all are too young to remember, but
13 Winston Churchill, the Prime Minister of Great Britain,
14 during World War II once made a statement that was very
15 true, even today. He said that the greatest and most
16 important duty a citizen can perform in peacetime is that
17 as a juror in our justice system.

18 And I thank you for your service to not only
19 Greenville County, but, also, to the State of South
20 Carolina, and our justice system.

21 Now, I wish there was something I could do for you
22 that would show my appreciation. But the only thing I can
23 suggest -- I think when you were qualified on Monday the
24 Judge asked you one of the questions being that how many
25 had served on a jury in the last three years. Well, the

1. only thing I can tell you is you will not be drawn for
2. jury service for another three years.

3. But, as I said earlier, I do thank you for your
4. service.

5. Madam Clerk, is there anything that the Clerk of
6. Court has for the jury?

7. THE CLERK: Yes. I need for the Foreperson to
8. sign --

9. THE COURT: How about any statements or anything?

10. THE CLERK: No.

11. THE COURT: All right. And the check will be in the
12. mail.

13. All right. With that, I excuse you all, except I do
14. need to see the Foreman.

15. You need to sign the paper here.

16. (Pause.)

17. THE COURT: Very good. Thank you very much.

18. And I do hope you have a wonderful weekend and
19. remainder of the summer, too.

20. Everyone else remain seated while the jury retires
21. from the courtroom.

22. (WHEREUPON, the jury was excused from open court at
23. approximately 10:44 a.m.)

24. THE COURT: All right. Is the State ready?

25. MR. GREGORY: Yes, Your Honor. The State is prepared

1 for sentencing.

2 Judge, may it please the Court.

3 At the appropriate time, the family members of the
4 victim would like to speak.

5 THE COURT: I, certainly, would like to hear from
6 them.

7 Is the Defendant ready?

8 MR. ROBINSON: We're ready.

9 THE COURT: Very good.

10 All right. You may proceed, Mr. Solicitor.

11 MR. GREGORY: Your Honor, you've heard the facts of
12 the case and the guilty verdict. The only thing else the
13 State would add is the Defendant's total jail time has
14 been 949 days. And I think all the facts are in evidence.
15 And that's all that we would have from the State at this
16 time.

17 THE COURT: All right. Prior record, I think we've
18 heard.

19 MR. GREGORY: Yes, Your Honor.

20 THE COURT: But, again, for the purposes of
21 sentencing.

22 MR. GREGORY: Your Honor, 2009, possession of crack
23 cocaine; 2009, possession with intent to distribute
24 cocaine base; and a 2010, assault and battery in the first
25 degree.

1 THE COURT: 2010?

2 MR. GREGORY: Yes, Your Honor.

3 THE COURT: And it was assault and battery of the
4 first degree, not assault and battery first offense?

5 MR. GREGORY: That's right, first degree.

6 THE COURT: And I think the sentence was -- it could
7 have been a suspended sentence. But the sentence was 10
8 years suspended upon the service of a certain time and
9 probation?

10 MR. GREGORY: That sounds correct, Your Honor. I'll
11 have to verify that.

12 THE COURT: All right. Also, on the murder charge,
13 the sentence is a range from, what, 30 years to life?

14 MR. GREGORY: That's correct.

15 THE COURT: And that's life without parole?

16 MR. GREGORY: We didn't serve life without parole.
17 It's just 30 to life range.

18 THE COURT: But I think the definition under our law
19 life means without parole. You didn't serve --

20 MR. GREGORY: Yes.

21 THE COURT: You didn't serve a capital notice?

22 MR. GREGORY: No. That's correct.

23 THE COURT: And then on the possession?

24 MR. GREGORY: Zero to five years, Your Honor.

25 THE COURT: And since this is not a capital

1 conviction of murder, then it is -- could be an additional
2 five years to the 30 years, or life?

3 MR. GREGORY: That's correct, Your Honor.

4 THE COURT: All right. Mr. Robinson.

5 MR. ROBINSON: May it please the Court.

6 I -- do you want to hear from the victims first?

7 THE COURT: Well, I don't know. I want to find
8 out -- whenever the Solicitor wants to present them.

9 MR. GREGORY: State your name.

10 THE COURT: All right. If you would, please, ma'am,
11 give us your name.

12 MS. MEGGAN JUSTICE: My name is Meggan Justice,
13 spelled M-E-G-G-A-N, J-U-S-T-I-C-E.

14 THE COURT: Very good. Thank you, ma'am.

15 I would like to hear from you.

16 MS. MEGGAN JUSTICE: This has been a long journey for
17 us. And we thank the jury for the verdict of guilty.

18 And when it comes to sentencing, I feel that he
19 should not get out. Because I no longer get to see my
20 brother. I no longer get to talk to him.

21 Even if he's in jail, he still has the opportunity to
22 see his parents, to see his brothers, and sisters. He
23 took that from us on Thanksgiving morning on November the
24 27th at around 3:00. And he doesn't deserve to get out.
25 He doesn't deserve to see the light of day. I would be

1 harsh to say I wish he was dead, too, but the God in me
2 won't let me say that.

3 So what I'm asking is for him never to be able to get
4 out and be with his family. We can no longer be with
5 ours. And I just want you to take that into
6 consideration.

7 THE COURT: Thank you very much, ma'am.

8 Yes, ma'am. Your name?

9 MS. PRATTY WASHINGTON: My name is Pratty Washington,
10 that's P-R-A-T-T-Y, W-A-S-H-I-N-G-T-O-N. I am the mother
11 of Sylvester Fuller.

12 THE COURT: Yes, ma'am.

13 MS. PRATTY WASHINGTON: Thank you, Your Honor.

14 I just want to say, for the record, that this has
15 never been a mission of hate. I'm not here in the name of
16 hate. I'm here in the name of pain and loss.

17 I feel bad for this young man. And I feel bad for
18 his family because I have suffered, and so have they. He
19 has no idea what he's put us both through. It has been
20 hard for both of us. These three years has been hard.

21 All I can say is I never get to see Sylvester again.
22 He called me the day before Thanksgiving and I blew it
23 off, Your Honor. I just blew it off because I was
24 working. I said I'll call him back later. And I can
25 never get that back. I regret not picking up that phone.

1 Because I had an opportunity to speak to him one more
2 time. And I'll never get that again.

3 And I have been trying my best to live life. And
4 every time I think I'm okay, I fall apart. It has been so
5 hard. I've gained so much weight. Sometimes, I don't
6 know if I'm coming or going. I think my life is back on
7 track and then I fall apart again.

8 But I feel bad for him, I do. And just like Meggan
9 said, the God in me, I cannot for one minute say I hate
10 somebody because God is full of love. But in the name of
11 the law, I want the law to be served, and to the fullest
12 extent of the law, sir.

13 THE COURT: Thank you.

14 MS. PRATTY WASHINGTON: Thank you, sir.

15 THE COURT: Yes, ma'am.

16 MS. MAISIE JUSTICE: My name is Maisie Justice,
17 M-A-I-S-I-E, last name Justice, J-U-S-T-I-C-E. And I'm
18 the sister of Jamal Justice.

19 And I, too, want to say that I'm not here out of
20 hate. The God in me won't allow me to hate this man for
21 what he did. But I, also, want the law to be served to
22 the fullest extent. Because I'm never going to see my
23 brother again.

24 That Thanksgiving, we planned on -- he planned on --
25 my dad planned on picking him up and us going out of town.

1 That's what I had to look forward to on Thanksgiving Day,
2 a family together, being together, at least, another day.
3 And that, also, too, was taken away from me.

4 And I just feel like, you know, I'm glad that the
5 verdict was guilty today. Even though I missed it, I'm
6 grateful I'm here.

7 And, I mean, I can't get my brother back. Why should
8 he be able to get out of jail at any time? I think he
9 should serve a life sentence in jail. I don't wish the
10 death penalty on anyone. But I feel like he should never
11 be able to see his family again. I'm never going to be
12 able to see my brother again. I can never pick up the
13 phone and call him. I can never have family functions
14 with him because his life was taken. For what? No
15 apparent reason. My brother was an innocent bystander.
16 That bullet was never even meant for him. And for him to
17 be shot three times, for what?

18 THE COURT: Yes, ma'am.

19 MS. MAISIE JUSTICE: That's all I have to say.

20 THE COURT: Thank you very much.

21 All right. Anything further from the State?

22 MR. GREGORY: Nothing further from the State, Your
23 Honor.

24 THE COURT: All right. Mr. Robinson, if you would,
25 please.

1 MR. ROBINSON: May it please the Court.

2 THE COURT: Yes, ma'am.

3 MS. VICTORIA WILLIAMS: I'm Victoria Williams,
4 V-I-C-T-O-R-I-A, Williams, W-I-L-L-I-A-M-S.

5 THE COURT: Yes, ma'am.

6 MS. VICTORIA WILLIAMS: I'm the mother of Bradford
7 Hester Williams. And I know that Bradford -- Bradford is
8 not a weapons guy. Bradford would not kill somebody, or
9 anything. I mean, he would not take a life. Bradford is
10 a loving, caring person.

11 Yes, Bradford was out there on the streets. But as
12 you notice his charges, there's never been a weapons
13 charge on Bradford. Because Bradford -- you know,
14 Bradford, he likes to defend himself with his hands, you
15 know. He's not going to, you know, coward out with a
16 weapon. He wouldn't take a life.

17 And I pray that the person that did it, their
18 conscience will bother them. And every time they sit down
19 at the table and set one plate, they see another one
20 sitting across from them. And that it will just eat them
21 alive and they will come forward and clear my child.

22 And I pray and I'm still hopeful that, you know, he
23 will not be spending his life in jail and that the
24 right -- the person that did it, you know, God will
25 prevail and that they will come forward and true justice

1 will be served. But this is for the family -- the
2 victim's family and for us.

3 Thank you.

4 THE COURT: Yes, ma'am.

5 Thank you.

6 Anyone else?

7 MR. RONALD WILLIAMS: Yes, sir. Your Honor, my name
8 is Ronald T. Williams. I'm Bradford's father.

9 And as my wife spoke to you earlier, first off all, I
10 want to say to the families that we're very sorry for
11 their losses.

12 As a father of sons, it is very difficult for me to
13 understand the loss of two sons. As my mother shares with
14 me in any case in time -- and my mother still lives --
15 that in disregard to what people are doing or people are
16 not doing, but when they lose their life, she always
17 looked at me and says, Ronnie, regardless, that's
18 somebody's child.

19 And in the same token, this is our child and we love
20 him. As my wife said, he's always taken pride in
21 defending himself. As boys growing up in a neighborhood
22 full of boys, boys are always testing. But weapons, no.

23 And to this day and forth, I will never believe that
24 he took the lives of somebody else with a gun. And he
25 fought somebody with his fists and taking them, I say he's

1 probably suffered for that. But the gun, no.

2 Again, I say to the family, I am very sorry for you,
3 for the loss of your brother, your son.

4 However, we will continue to do whatever necessary to
5 find the truth so we can benefit our son, Your Honor.

6 Thank you.

7 THE COURT: Thank you, sir.

8 MR. ROBINSON: Judge --

9 THE COURT: Yes, sir.

10 MR. ROBINSON, -- may it please the Court.

11 Brad would like to say something to the Court.

12 THE COURT: Very good.

13 DEFENDANT WILLIAMS: Your Honor, I would like to
14 thank the Court for taking the time to hear my case.

15 I'd, also, like to apologize for the loss of their
16 family.

17 But in this case, I maintain my innocence. I did not
18 take these gentlemen's life. Even though my life has been
19 taken [sic], I still do not have ill will toward the
20 family. Because at the end of the day, I would feel the
21 exact same way y'all feel.

22 I appreciate the Court's time.

23 Thank you.

24 THE COURT: Anything further from the Defendant?

25 MR. ROBINSON: No, sir, Judge.

1 We leave that in your hands in this case. And we ask
2 for mercy, obviously, at this time.

3 THE COURT: All right. Mr. Solicitor, anything
4 further from you?

5 MR. GREGORY: Not from the State, Your Honor.

6 THE COURT: Can the Defendant come around?

7 Mr. Robinson, could you come with him?

8 MR. ROBINSON: Yes, sir.

9 THE COURT: Or would you want --

10 MR. ROBINSON: I'm better here. But I can --

11 THE COURT: All right. Well, that's fine. But I
12 will ask the Defendant to stand.

13 Do you have the sentencing sheets?

14 MR. GREGORY: I passed them up, Your Honor.

15 THE COURT: Oh, wait. Here we go. I'm sorry.

16 (Pause.)
